**Fifty-two Insurgents Killed—More Voluntary Surrenders—Rebels Everywhere in Confusion.**

HAVANA, April 13, 1870.

A telegram from Captain General de Rodas, dated Puerto Principe, April 10, is published here to-day.

The column of marines had killed fifty-two insurgents, including Manuel Agnero and Francisco Leacas, leaders of the rebels.

Voluntary surrenders continued. Every day numbers of the enemy come into the Spanish camp and claim the protection guaranteed by the amnesty proclamation.

The rebels are everywhere in confusion.
