Marine Disasters—Wreck of Three Vessels.

HAVANA, April 25, 1870.

The German brig Schwulbe, from St. Marc to Falmouth, with a cargo of coffee and other goods, was wrecked at Inagua. Nine hundred and eighty-seven bags of coffee, in good condition, were saved.

The British bark Janet from Havana to Queens-town, with a cargo of molasses, was wrecked at Harbor Island. One hundred and forty hogsheads were saved and landed here.

The American brig Galveston from Galveston to Liverpool, was also wrecked. She carried a cargo of cotton, all of which were saved, some of it in a damaged condition. The whole of it was landed here.
