The Lloyd Aspinwall Released—Her Captain Refuses to Leave Until Indemnified—Movements of General Jordan.

HAVANA, April 23, 1870.

The Spanish authorities here have consented to release the steamer Lloyd Aspinwall, and to-day notified the United States Consul General to that effect. Her captain, however, refused to receive her unless his claim of \$300 per day, as indemnity for her detention, is paid. After some delay the Consul General consented to accept the steamer from the government and hoisted the American flag on board.

Advices by the steamship Morro Castle confirm the report of General Jordan's being at St. Thomas. He proceeds to New York on the return trip of the steamer.
