

THE CUBAN LEAGUE.

The Death of General Goicouria Denounced as an Act of Barbarism.

The Executive Committee of the Cuban League held a strictly secret meeting yesterday afternoon at No. 119 Broadway. Even the members of the press were excluded. Among those present were Generals C. K. Graham, M. T. McMahon, C. W. Darling, Major Lockwood, Colonels Ethan Allen, Mason and Oakey, and T. E. Stewart.

The following resolutions were offered and unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That the Cuban League have heard with profound regret and horror of the cold-blooded and barbarous murder of the patriot citizen General Domingo S. Goicouria, executed in Havana without trial or opportunity for defence, that we denounce it as a crime against humanity and civilization, and the crowning act of a long series of atrocities which should receive the emphatic condemnation, if not of the government, at least of the people of the United States.

Resolved, That the President of the United States be requested to take such measures as may be necessary to obtain from the Spanish authorities in Cuba the body of General Goicouria for interment in the land of his adoption.

Resolved, That we offer the sincere sympathy of the League to the wife and family of the martyred patriot.

The meeting, after adopting these resolutions, adjourned.
