Captured Cannon—Spanish Clemency—Stories of More Rebels Seeing the Error of Their Ways.

HAVANA, May 15, 1870.

The cannon recently captured in the Middle Department have arrived in Havana and were to-day taken through the streets in triumph.

A number of ladies in Trinidad were recently sentenced to imprisonment, but through the intercession of the American Consul at Trinidad the Captain General has commuted their punishment to exile.

The insurgent leader Manuel Caridad, with one cannon and forty men, all armed, voluntarily surrendered at Camarones. Caridad and some of his men tendered their services to the government and were permitted to assist the troops in their search for other insurgents. In consequence of this surrender two hundred persons have presented themselves for pardon to the authorities in the Trinidad jurisdiction.
