

MR. FISH'S NEUTRALITY is a very remarkable sort of neutrality. He allows thirty Spanish gunboats to leave this port to make war on the Cuban insurgents against Spain, but will not allow a Canadian troop ship to pass through the Sault St. Marie Canal for war purposes against the Red River insurgents. But why the Secretary should make this nice distinction in favor of Spain we cannot understand, except upon the theory that he is resolved that Spain shall continue in the occupation of Cuba, so far as our neutrality can be applied, and that, on the other hand, it is well to be on the right side of the Fenians.
