## The Cuban Question—Anglo-American Diplomacy Towards the Colony.

MADRID, May 23, 1870.

The proceedings in the Constituent Cortes on Saturday were quite interesting. One of the Deputies questioned the Ministers as to the truth of the rumored concert of action on the part of Great Britain and the United States to effect a mitigation of the so-called Spanish horrors in Cuba.

Señor Moret, the Minister for the Colonies, replied.—He said, while such rumors had been extensively published the government was without official information on the subject. While the matter was before the Deputies he desired to remind them that De Rojas, the Captain-General of Cuba, had repeatedly invited American commissioners to visit Cuba and see for themselves how utterly false these stories were.

## Prim and the Iberian Union.

PARIS, May 23, 1870.

Letters from Madrid confirm the previous reports that General Prim has a direct understanding with General Saldanha, whereby an Iberian union is to be established.
