

THE CUBAN POLICY.—It is hinted in Washington that Secretary Fish will have to back water on his foreign policy when the report of the House Committee in reference to Cuba comes up, which may be to-morrow. It seems that he was rather indignant that the republican members did not defend him in the spontaneous discussion that sprang up on the question last Tuesday, and he recently said as much to General Banks, who, however, declined to act as his apologist in the matter. The House is strongly in favor of some aid to Cuba without regard to any partisan questions, and it is thought that such an impressive discussion will ensue on Banks' report that Fish will be thrown high and dry out of the State Department.
