**Another Raid on Foreign Residents—Freemasons Re-arrested—More Rebels Reported Killed—Cuban Correspondence Captured—Death of Senor Lerda.**

HAYANA, June 13, 1870.

The police have arrested a number of foreign residents who attended a meeting of a Masonic lodge here three months ago. It will be remembered that the law forbidding the meeting of secret societies was put in force at that time; that a meeting of a Masonic lodge was broken up, and all attending it were thrown into jail, but the foreign members were subsequently released by order of the Captain General. The reasons for the re-arrest of the latter, so long after the event, are unknown.

Despatches from the Captain General's headquarters at Puerto Principe report that Colonel Montaner has captured a rebel fort on Maximo river and killed eighteen of the enemy. The detachment under Colonel Vergel shot several rebels, and among them their leader, Laborda.

Captain Chiclana, in command of a party of loyal guerillas, reports eighteen rebels killed and sixteen taken prisoners in the San Miguel mountains.

The Spanish gunboat Neptune has captured important correspondence addressed to Cespedes and other rebel officers.

The Spanish steamer Vigia, off Cayo Guajaba, captured five boats filled with families of the insurgents.

Señor Lerda, rebel Minister of War, died recently of fever.
