Cholera in Cuba—Large Percentage of Deaths—Smallpox Unabated.

HAVANA, June 23, 1870.

A number of cases of Asiatic cholera have occurred here within a few days, a large percentage resulting fatally. The Civil Governor, Señor Roberts, is taking the necessary precautions to prevent the spread of the disease. The smallpox is unabated. Several deaths have also occurred on board the gunboats cruising off Sagua. In the interior cholera of a virulent type is prevailing in many places. As yet there have been but few cases of vomito.
