Do Rodas Says He Captured the Second Cargo of the Upton—More Outrages.

HAVANA, June 25, 1870.

Captain General de Rodas telegraphs to Havana that he has captured the second cargo of the steamer Upton on her return from Aspinwall. It is more valuable than the first.

Montaner's column had killed twelve of Sanguill's band, including an American colonel. The reaction in the interior was the cause of many outrages. The insurgent Ortega and his family were on the road to surrender when they were captured. Two other men in attempting to surrender were caught and hanged and their families outraged. Parties are forming who resist the conscriptors and refuse aid to the revolutionists.
