## A Cuban Leader Surrenders—He is Pardoned, Subsequently Tried and then Executed—Markets.

HAVANA, June 28, 1870.

Gonzalez Junco, an insurgent leader, who surrendered some time ago to the Spanish authorities at Villa Clara and was pardoned by the government, was tried and convicted last week for crimes committed by him while he was a rebel leader, and executed this morning at Fort Cabanas.

The sugar market is quiet and quotations are unchanged. Exchange on London, 15 a 15½ per cent premium; on Paris, 2 per cent premium; on the United States, sixty days' sight, in currency, 7 per cent discount; short sight, 5½ per cent discount; in gold, short sight, 5¼ per cent premium.
