

CUBA'S DAUGHTERS IN COUNCIL.

The Sallow Loungers to Have an Example from the Women.

Yesterday afternoon a large number of Cuban ladies met in one of the parlors of the St. Julien Hotel for the purpose of devising means whereby they can effect something like concert of action among the ladies of New York, regardless of nationality, who are favorable to the cause of Cuba. Mrs. Fernandes presided and Mrs. Emilia C. De Villaverde acted as secretary. During the meeting the ladies decided to give a theatrical performance in Spanish, and ere long, the principal actors in which will be Cuban ladies and gentlemen. They also propose to solicit funds for a grand fair in aid of the cause, to be held on the 6th of September next. If they are successful in raising the necessary funds they promise to make the fair a grand success. They will introduce as one of its principal features a shooting gallery for the ladies, and they now declare that if the many Cuban men now loitering about New York city will not go back to Cuba and take up arms in her defence they will.

They say New York is full of Cuban men, who loiter about the hotels, write a good deal of "buncombe" to the papers, talk of what they can do and have done, abuse the administration for its course; but none of them ever think of going back to the island and there assist the struggling patriots to throw off the galling yoke of tyranny which Spain is trying to hold them under.

The meeting adjourned at four o'clock, to meet again next Saturday, at the same time and place, when they hope to meet all the ladies of New York who are friendly to the cause of Cuba.
