

OUR CORRESPONDENCE FROM CUBA, published this morning, reports much despondency in Spanish circles because of the refusal of the home government to send more troops to the island. The guerilla system of warfare adopted by the insurgents will enable them to carry on the contest for an indefinite period of time. Cholera, smallpox and yellow fever had combined with the Cubans against the Spaniards, and not even the satisfaction felt with the message of President Grant to Congress could impart confidence to the adherents of Spain.
