

## CUBA.

The West India Cable to be Submerged Immediately—Fight Near Moron—Probable Cuban Victory.

HAVANA, July 11, 1873.

A telegraphic despatch from Cienfuegos announces the arrival at that port yesterday of the Panama and West India Cable Company's steamers Dacia and Suffolk, and the British man-of-war Vestal. The work of laying the cable will be immediately commenced by the Dacia and Suffolk.

During an engagement lately near Moron, between the Spaniards and insurgents, Lieutenant Patino, of the Spanish army, and eighteen soldiers were killed. Seventeen insurgents were also killed. Colonel Noval also attacked this same body of insurgents on the 7th inst., killing thirty-one of their number.

Great excitement exists throughout the island over the European complications.

The schooner Nelly Taibot was towed into this port to-day dismantled.
