### Reported Assassination of a Cuban General— More Talk About Intended Surrenders—Al- leged Brigands Arrested.

HAVANA, July 25, 1870.

It is reported that the Cuban General Cornelio Porro has been assassinated by his men, who had heard that he intended to surrender to the Spaniards.

The Cuban chiefs, Fortun, Castellanos and Frere, recently visited General Caro's camps, it is supposed, to surrender themselves. But they did not find the General, who had left for Menanagua at the head of 3,000 men, and withdrew.

The gendarmes have captured eleven men belonging to Carlos Garcia's band of brigands, who have committed robberies and outrages in the neighborhood of Bejucal. Seven were identified and have been sentenced to death.

General Goyeneche has arrived in Havana.
