The Spanish Cortes and the Cuban Volunteers—The Work on the West India Cable Progressing.

HAVANA, July 23, 1870.

The Cuban journals continue to be filled with the protests of the volunteers of the island against the language of Diaz Quintero, a Deputy to the Spanish Cortes. Quintero, in a speech before the Cortes, stated that the volunteers of Cuba were a dishonor to the country. The colonels of the Havana volunteers will send a document to Spain to-morrow asking that the Cortes censure Quintero.

The Panama and West India Cable Company's steamer Suffolk has passed the dangerous channel. Twenty-seven miles of cable have been laid up to this morning. The communication between the shore and the steamer Suffolk is perfect.
