The Daughters of Cuba.

A meeting of the society known as the Daughters of Cuba was held yesterday, at No. 309 Fifth-avenue, to take into consideration the actions of Don Juan de Clementa Zenea, and to elect officers for the ensuing quarter. It is charged that Senor ZENEA went to Cuba with letters of recommendation from Senors ALDAMA and MESTRA. He waited upon President CESPEDES, and made to him many false statements concerning the condition of the Cubans in the United States. He was flually captured by the Spaniards, when it was discovered that he had upon him a Spanish passport. It is stated that he told CESPEDES that the Cubans in this City were without funds, and that no more aid could be expected from them, and that for future operations they must depend upon themselves or surrender to the Spaniards. These facts are related by Mme. CESPEDES, who was present at the interview.

Resolutions condemning ZENEA as a traitor, and upholding him to the execration of man-

kind, were passed.

The following officers were elected: Mrs. Dr. Embil., President; Mrs. C. De Casada, Vice-President; Mrs. E. O. Vieleverde, Secretary; Mrs. Fernandez, Vice-Secretary; and Mrs. C. Del Castillo, Treasurer. A committee of three was appointed to raise funds to provide medicine and clothing for the families of the lugurgents, and the meeting then adjourned.
