Maximo Gomez, the Insurgent General—Sanguinary Counsel—Marriage of an Insurgent Before his Execution—Another Battle at Las Tunas—Twenty-five Insurgents Killed—Execution of a Cuban Colonel.

HAVANA, March 11.—The *Diario*, of today, in an editorial article, advocates placing a price upon the head of MAXIMO GOMEZ, the insurgent General, assigning as a reason that GOMEZ is a foreigner and an incendiary. The insurgent, Capt. CARLOS CERICE LOMENTS, before being led to execution at Cienfuegos, was married. An engagement took place recently at Las Tunas, during which twenty-five insurgents were killed. The frigate *Gerona* has sailed for Lagnayra. Three miles of brush and under-growth have been burned between the forts of Jata and Polvoorin, on the line of the Puerto Principe Railroad. The people of Nuevitas are preparing arches, and the Puerto Principeans are arranging their houses for the reception of VALMASEDA. Col. HORACIO SIMONI has been captured and executed near Magarabomba. There is a rumor of the death of the Marquis of SANTA LUCIA and EDUARDO FIGUEREDO.
