

WEST INDIES.

Manipulation of the New-York Mail by the Cuban Government—The Bishop of Havana.

HAVANA, April 13.—On the arrival of the steamer *Missouri* yesterday from New-York, the Government took charge of the mail, and every letter contained in it was registered. After this operation, which occupied several hours, the mails were distributed.

The Bishop of Havana, who was a passenger on the *Missouri*, still remains on board the steamer, the Government refusing him permission to land. The Bishop is allowed to go wherever he chooses outside of Cuba. The public applaud the determination of the authorities.

Government Affairs in Porto Rico.

HAVANA, April 13.—Advices to the 2d inst. have been received from Porto Rico. Gen. BALDRICK has again assumed the Captain-Generalship. ROMERO, his newly-appointed Secretary, will not take possession of his office for the present. The list of Deputies to the Cortes, soon to be voted for, has been published.
