Landing of Quesada with Two Hundred Men—Sharp Encounters with the Spaniards—The Latter Reticent on the Result.

HAVANA, July 13.—The landing of RAFAEL QUESADA with 200 Venezuelans on the morning of the 9th inst. at Ciego Santana de Lleo, ten leagues from Santiago de Cuba, is confirmed. Several engagements have taken place between the Spanish troops and the Venezuelans and insurgents, commanded by LUIS FIGUEREDO and GAUCHO VEGA, at Ciego Lareto and Santa Rosa.

The official accounts state that a large number of the filibusters were either killed or wounded, and that some of the Spanish troops were also killed and wounded. A quantity of camp equipage belonging to the insurgents has been captured, also seven flags and ammunition, and fourteen carbines. The Spaniards continue the pursuit of the insurgents. Official telegrams remain silent about the movements of the steamer *Virginia*.
