CUBA.

More Fighting—Two Expeditions Land- ed from Venezuela—The Steamer Vir- ginia with the Third put Back to Trinidad.

HAVANA, July 19.—Gen. PALANCA telegraphs on the 13th inst. that engagements had occurred on the day before, in which 100 insurgents were killed; the rest were dispersed. Nine Spaniards were killed and ten wounded. According to the Manzanillo correspondent of the *Diario*, two expeditions of filibusters from Venezuela had landed in Cuba. QUESADA'S proclamation announced the sailing of three expeditions in the steamers *Virginia*, *Bolivar*, and another, name not known. No official confirmation of the second landing has come to hand.

ST. THOMAS, July 14, via PORTO RICO, July 15.—The steamer *Virginia* has returned to the island of Trinidad, having been unable to land her expedition in Cuba. The Spanish war steamer *Tornado*, at Porto Cabello, will probably go to Trinidad.
