THE HORNET FITTED UP AS A BLOCKADE RUNNER—ONE CARGO SAFELY LANDED IN CUBA AND ANOTHER ON BOARD—STORES OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION GATHERED AT DIFFERENT POINTS FOR SHIPMENT.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—It is now understood that the Cuban rebels intended to arm the Hornet as a cruiser, but only to fit her for service as a blockade runner. It is believed that she has made her first successful trip, landing a much-needed cargo at Nigri Bay, and that she is again on her way to Cuba from Aspin-

wall, having another cargo of arms on board. A large number of rifles, some field-pieces, with full equipments, and a quantity of munitions, fixed ammunition, shell, &c., have been sent to Angiowall and other points, and the Horack is expected to effect the landing of these in Cuba for the use of the insurgents.
