**A Railroad Bridge Destroyed by the Rebels—
An Important Engagement and Defeat of the
Rebels—No Expedition Landed at Vuelta
Abajo—Earthquake at Santiago de Cuba.**

HAVANA, Feb. 21, 1871.

The insurgents have destroyed the Enomitano Railroad bridge between Santiago de Cuba and Villa del Cobre.

An engagement of some importance has taken place at Manacas del Abragrande, in the jurisdiction of Moron, between 600 or 700 insurgents, commanded by Bolitel. The insurgents were defeated, and had fifteen killed. The Spaniards had two killed. The insurgents were awaiting the arrival of Salome Hernandez, with 400 men and one cannon from Camaguay, with the purpose of attacking isolated Spanish detachments and protecting the disembarkment of the Quesada expedition.

No expedition has landed at Vuelta Abajo.

A despatch from Santiago de Cuba, received to-day, states that several shocks of earthquake were felt there yesterday and to-day, but no damage was done. Shocks of earthquake were felt at Trinidad de Cuba last week.
