

THE WAR IN CUBA—HORRIBLE ATROCITIES.—By special telegram from the HERALD'S correspondent in Havana we learn that the most horrible atrocities are now being carried on by the Spaniards and the rebels. It was only yesterday that we announced the capture and killing of an entire party of contra guerillas; to-day we hear that the volunteers roasted a man alive, first driving a stake through his body, and that an entire family, consisting of old men, women and children, was murdered by Spanish troops. Thus the war goes on; and, as we thought it would, it now assumes a shape in which no quarter is given. We must be prepared to hear henceforward of many such terrible atrocities, that are a burning disgrace to those who perpetrate them. When will this wholesale murder cease? When will peace be once more restored to the distracted portions of the Island of Cuba?
