SURRENDER OF GEN. MARMOL.

HAVANA, June 18.—The Cuban Gen. Eduardo Marmol, who, at the beginning of the revolution, raised a band of 400 negroes in the jurisdiction of Quantanamo, recently offered to surrender to Gen. Palanca, at Santiago de Cuba. Gen. Palanca refused to accept his surrender unless Marmol brought a certain number of insurgents with him, which the Spanish Government demands as a condition for the pardon of an officer of his rank. Marmol thereupon went to Ciego de Avila, accompanied by a friend, and surrendered to the Spanish commander. As he came without the prescribed number of men, he will probably be shot.
