THE COURT WAS OPENED BY PROCLAMATION.

Francisco Chenard at present of the *City of Brooklyn* State of New York, came into Court and applied to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America, pursuant to the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Title XXX, Naturalization, Sections 2163 to 2174 inclusive, and the Acts of Congress amendatory thereof. And the said applicant *being examined and sworn* thereupon produced to the Court *proof that he arrived in the United States under 18 years of age & has continued to reside therein to the present time*

thereupon also produced to the said Court satisfactory proof, that he has resided within the United States of America five years at least, and within the State of New York one year at least, during which time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States of America, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same. And the said applicant having also made such declaration and renunciation as are by the provisions and directions of Statute aforesaid required, Thereupon, it is considered by the Court that the said *Francisco Chenard* be admitted, and he is accordingly admitted by the said Court, a Citizen of the United States of America.
