An election began and held in Savannah in Chatham County and State of Georgia on the twenty third day of August one thousand Eight hundred and fifty six for a Second Lieutenant and Ensign of the Savannah Volunteer Guards a volunteer Company attached to the first regiment Georgia Militia due as legal notice having been given. The polls were opened in due form under the superintendence of a Justice of the Peace and Freeholders who were accordingly sworn when the following persons entitled to vote came forward and deposited their votes as follows
