

Boston June 5, 1835

Darwin,

It is very ^{Kindly} ^{to} ^{be} ^{remembered} ^{that} ^{King} [&] ^{Adams} were called on as defaulters. I found that Bank was not in the which the Court granted. The amounts are now in the hands of the Marshal for the arrest of the Debtors.

I had reason to apprehend that H & J had left secretly. I went on board of the Thames for Grey from to search for certain papers that I knew were here from Philadelphia hoping an excuse for Grey Indice - I found some on board. I also had a person watching on board of the Carpenter steamer but King & Adams were not there. On return to my office

I found that the Journal of King Mr
Eggs was there accordingly arranged
by the default taken this morning &
stating that he did not expect his
cheat to be called until tomorrow
when a key, would be ready.

He invited me to review the
default. I declined, and told him
Kenny & Peters must be in court
tomorrow ready for trial. He said
they would not be ready, but he
would come to grant the indictment
I have no fears in that point.

I shall have all my witnesses
in court & assure that Kenny & Peters
will give bail.

Our term has now come
and I hope the Court will not make
any mistake hereafter.
