

HAVANA, Oct. 20 (AP) — The hurricane casualty list mounted today to at least twenty-five dead and 700 injured along the north coast of Cuba.

Steps are being taken to relieve suffering among 45,000 made homeless by the storm. The United States Government has been asked to arrange the dispatch of a million eggs and 60,000 cases of canned milk, and the Cuban Government also is seeking large quantities of flour and beans.

A Navy plane flew 3,500,000 units of serum from undamaged Santiago de Cuba to meet the danger of an epidemic resulting from a shortage of clean water and food on the north coast.
