

Cuban Ex-Police Chief Accused of Revolt Plot

HAVANA, June 13—President Fulgencio Batista forced Gen. Manuel Benitez to resign as chief of national police because he was plotting a military coup, according to a statement issued today by Gen. Manuel Lopez Migoya, army chief of staff, and Brig. Gens. Francisco Tabernilla, Ignacio Galindez and Abelardo Gomez.

The four generals, who were part of the group that put President Batista in control of Cuba in 1933, stated that General Benitez, angered by the failure of the President to use the military authorities to sway the elections for the Government coalition, had declared he would "prevent anyone from taking possession of the Presidency."

General Benitez was placed under arrest until his departure for Miami, according to the statement.
