Sefior Prio and his aide, Rafael Izquierdo, arrived here by plane May 9 and reported they were expelled from Cuba by the National Police. They were notified Monday by the Department of Justice that their presence in this country was prejudicial to the public interest.

Señor Prio has acknowledged he was active in a previous exile in efforts to overthrow the regime of President Fulgencio Ba-

tista, who deposed him in 1952.
