exile magazine Replica were dynamited in what police sources said was a continuation of political unrest in Miami's "Little Havana" section.

MIAMI—The offices of the Cuban

Detective Mike Gonzalez said the bomb was placed at the door of the magazine's offices. He said damage to the door, awning and the office inside was extensive.

The unrest in the nation's largest

Cuban community began a month ago with the shooting death of Jose Elias de la Torriente, a prominent exile businessman who gained public attention several years ago for his "work plan for (Cuba's) liberation."

Four days after Torriente's slaying, another exile leader. Arturo Rodri-

guez-Vives, was shot to death in his New York City apartment.

No link has been established between the two killings, or the bombing.
