

Hudson Jury Acts, Indicts 2 Brothers

JERSEY CITY — The Hudson County Grand Jury has indicted two brothers, allegedly members of a Cuban nationalist organization, on charges of possessing explosives with unlawful intent.

Named as defendants in the indictment presented to Superior Court Judge Peter P. Artaserse were Guillermo Novo, 29, of 1414 91st St., North Bergen, and Ignacio Novo, 28, of New York City. They were arrested last June 29 in a shoe store they operated at 773 Bergen Ave.

The Novo brothers were arrested in 1964 when they were accused of firing a bazooka at the United Nations Building in New York while Fidel Castro was attending a session there. However, they were acquitted of that offense because police had obtained confessions from them in violation of their constitutional rights.

Also indicted were two men and a woman charged with the \$5,000 holdup last June 19 of the Western Slope branch of the First National Bank of Jersey City at Kennedy Boulevard and Thorne Street.

The defendants, Sergio Castro, 35, of 2510 Cottage Ave., North Bergen; Ralph Loreto, 21, of

Miami, Fla., and Mrs. Tamara Luzo Pino, 24, of New York City, were arrested within three hours of the holdup.
