## Nab Third Cuban In Explosion Plot

A Cuban national, who was attending a hearing yesterday for two friends arrested and charged with conspiring to blow up Cuban property, was himself arrested and charged with the same crime.

Hector Diaz Limontes, 35, of 521 22nd St., Union City, a member of the Cuban Nationalist Movement, was arrested by the FBI in the law offices of U.S. Commissioner Thomas W. Clohosey in Newark.

According to the FBI and a spokesman for the movement, Diaz was in the law office for a

hearing of two friends arrested May 20. Guillermo Novo Sampol, 29, of 583 55th St., West New York, and Felipe Martinez Y. Blanca, 25, of 316 44th St., Union City.

All three men have been charged with conspiring to blow up Cuban ships and property in Canada. All three are members of the Movement, a militant anti-Castro organization.

Bail for Diaz was set at \$10,000 at his arraignment before Commissioner Clohosey, while at the earlier hearing, when he was arrested, bail was lowered for his two friends.

Novo, who is on probation for possession of explosives, had his bail reduced from \$50,000 to \$25,000 and Martinez had his bail reduced from \$25,000 to \$10,000. Neither could post bail.

Diaz is married and is employed as a roofing contractor. According to a spokesman for the Movement, he is a Cuban national who took part in the abortive Bay of Pigs invasion in 1961.
