

A spokesman for Command L-66 is quoted as saying that new raids on Cuba will be carried out as soon as the money is available. No mention is made of locale from which the raids will originate nor is mention made of the materials to be used.

The caption was formerly carried as Command L 66.

Special Agent in Charge, Office of Naval Intelligence, 10th Naval District, San Juan, Puerto Rico on January 28, 1963 advised that approximately 100 copies of a "flyer" had been found within the boundaries of the Martin Pena antenna field located in Hab Rey, Puerto Rico on January 23, 1963. The "flyer," printed in the Spanish language on blue reper approximately 4" X 52", was in the opinion of dropped from an airplane. 

According to Comandos L 66 was organized to collect funds for commando type attacks on the island of Cuba. The idea was originated with the organization Alpha 65 in which the Cuban exiles lost faith when it was made public that Alpha 66 was associated with EIOY GUTIERREZ MENOYO of the Second Front of the Escambray, another anti-CASTRO organization.

The name "Comandos" is taken from the commando-type activities and attacks in which the organization will take part.

The letter "L" stands for "liberted (liberty) labor (labor) and lucha (fight)." To the knowledge of the "L" at no.time has stood for "lobanilla."

The "66" indicates, as it did in Alpha 66, that 66 men will take part in the actions of the group. said there are only a few individuals who are in the group and that at no time have there been 66 men involved.

said the Comandos L 66 had never been called "Comandos Ponce." Comandos Ponce was the name given to the first attack on Cuba by Alpha 66 because the majority of funds for this operation were raised at Ponce, Puerto Rico.



It is also known as "Commando Ponce" the name of the place where Alpha 66 was founded and also as "L 66," presumably Lobanillos 66.





ALVAREZ has a 45 foot cabin cruiser called the "Alisan". His group also has a 83 foot ex-Coast Guard boat in the Miami River at Miami and recently had obtained a 93 foot boat near Tampa, Florida. They had been in the process of bringing this 93 foot boat to Miami, however, numerous breakdowns and high expenses have caused many difficulties and as yet this boat is not in Miami.

Alvarez Modrigues, 541 Morthwest 45th Avenue, Miami, a former medical dector and senator in Cuba, stated that he owns and operates the "Alisan," a cabin cruiser which he brought from Cuba. He said that the "Alisan" left Miami on March 17th and met with a twenty-three foot twin engine boat near Cat Cay, after which they proceeded in a southerly direction, and on the early morning of March 27th, the small boat was used in an attack against Cuba. He refused to identify the participants.

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Alvarez claimed that the bomb used in the March 27th attack was made in the Bahamas with materials previously brought from the United States. He advised that no arms used in the attack were taken out of or brought into the United States. He stated that the "Alisan" and the twenty-three foot boat were both clean of arms or any type of bomb upon their return to Miami.

Mr. Alvarez also said that this expedition was financed through contributions by his friends and various sympathizers who donated small amounts for the

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COMMANDO L-66 purpose of buying gasoline, food and other provisions. He stated that there were no Americans in any way connected with this group, and that this particular expedition was not supported by any United States aid or backing. not be confused with Alpha 66, headed by Antonio vecisms who, frequently claims credit for operations of Commando L-66.
