The January 31, 1961 issue of "Diario Las Americas", Spanish language daily newspaper published in Miami, Florida, contains an article on page 12, column 1, stating that the "Organizacion 30 de Noviembre" (30th of November Organization), formed by revolutionary worker's leaders such as DAVID SALVADOR, had been integrated with the Revolutionary Democratic Front of ANTONIO VARONA.

It is noted that the 30th of November Organization of DAVID SALVADOR is the group which subject said he was representing in the United States.

Miami will conduct no further investigation and report due to be submitted February 10, 1961, will be held in abeyance until Bureau furnishes results

The February 4, 1961 issue of the "Miami News" contained an article reflecting that the Bal Harbour Police had discovered and confiscated about 800 lbs. of dynamite on February 3, 1961. It was stated that the dynamite had been immediately dumped at sea as it was deteriorating and in a dangerous condition. The police surmised that the dynamite may have been destined for Cuba to be used against CASTRO by counterrevolutionary groups.

The February 10, 1961 issue of the "Diario Las Americas", Spanish language daily newspaper published in Miami, Florida, contains an article captioned "Statements of 'Alejandro' about the Front '30th of November' ". This article stated that the 30th of November Movement is one of the most distinguished clandestine movements in action against CASTRO and that the "National Coordinator" of the movement, known by the cover name "ALEJANDRO" had recently arrived in Miami and had been interviewed by the newspaper. The interview thereafter set forth a general picture of the composition and plans of the 30th of November Movement.

On February 15, 1961, RAUL RODRIGUEZ, 1250 S. W. 6th Street, Miami, Florida, presented himself at the Miami Office of the FBI and advised that he had come to the FBI Office to register the 30th of November Movement. RODRIGUEZ stated that he was the Coordinator of the Movement and had come to Miami on January 28, 1961 for the purpose of organizing the movement in Miami. He said that he also hoped to obtain some sort of unity with the other movements in Miami.

RODRIGUEZ was advised that he could write to the Registration Section of the United States Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., in connection with his desire to register.

Confidential sources, who are generally familiar with certain phases of Cuban activity in the Miami area, were contacted and advised that they were not in possession of any pertinent information regarding the activities of the subject.

1. The 30th of November Movement

(b7c)
(b7d) Organized in about April, 1960, by DAVID SALVADOR, who was then the leader of the CTC (Confederacion Trabajadores Cubanos)(Confederation of Cuban Workers), an organization with which all union members are affiliated. [REDACTED] stated the 30th of November is the largest single counter-revolutionary group in Cuba today, and is composed mainly of members of the working class.

2. Movement of Revolutionary Recovery (MRR)

This group was founded by and continues to follow MANUEL ARTIME. ARTIME, who is presently in exile in the United States, has lost some support due to difficulty in maintaining liaison with those still in Cuba.

3. Rescate (Rescue)

The group of MANUEL ANTONIO DE VARONA. VARONA, presently in exile in the United States, has been a leader in the FRD (Frente Revolucionario Democratico)(Revolutionary Democratic Front) which is composed of numerous anti-Castro organizations in the United States.

4. Revolutionary Movement of the People (MRP)

The group of MANUEL RAY, who is also in exile in Miami. This group at one time was the most significant counterrevolutionary organization in Cuba, but support of it and RAY has declined drastically since RAY fled to the United States.

5. Christian Democratic Movement

Composed of the supporters of JOSE IGNACIO RASCO, and the least important of the counterrevolutionary groups.

[REDACTED] in addition to the above groups there is an organization called Accion Cubana (Cuban Action) which is active in the provinces of Havana, Oriente and Camaguey only and which has considerable support.

Regarding the 30th of November Movement, [REDACTED] in contrast to most other groups it has almost all of its members in Cuba and is composed of small cells, each of which is made up of a group of workers who are fellow employees. DAVID SALVADOR, founder and leader of the movement, was arrested by G-2 several months ago, and since that time the leadership of the group has been taken over by others. CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA was the General Coordinator of the Movement in the Escambray area and is presently in the United States in connection with plans to unite the Movement with other important anti-Castro groups in the FRD. He stated this has been accomplished and the 30th of November Movement is now affiliated with the FRD.

Regarding DAVID SALVADOR he noted that he has in the past made speeches and statements which were anti-United States in character. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He stated that while SALVADOR had been a Communist Party member in his youth, he soon abandoned the Party when he became familiar with the true nature of the communist conspiracy. When he later became prominent in union affairs in Cuba he was instrumental in removing some communists from office and preventing others from taking control of the unions. He said SALVADOR presently is opposed to communism and the Communist Party, as evidenced by his action in opposition to the communist regime of FIDEL CASTRO.

b7d) [REDACTED] SALVADOR is confined in the La Cabana prison. Prior to the execution of Major WILLIAM MORGAN, the American who was one of the leading figures when CASTRO was in the fight against BATISTA, and who later was arrested by the Cuban Government as a counterrevolutionary, SALVADOR and MORGAN, who was also confined at La Cabana, became close friends. The 30th of November Movement had developed a plan to bring about the escape of SALVADOR and MORGAN, the plan to be put into operation in early 1961, but just before it was initiated a Miami radio announcer, JUAN AMADOR RODRIGUEZ, broadcast a report that SALVADOR and MORGAN were rumored to have escaped from La Cabana. [REDACTED] this resulted in the decision to execute MORGAN. Increased security measures made escape by either SALVADOR or MORGAN impossible.

He said MORGAN had been actively engaged in supplying food and arms to the counterrevolutionary forces fighting in the Escambray prior to his arrest and, in fact, this was what caused his arrest. [REDACTED]

(b7c) [REDACTED] recently received information that the counterrevolutionary groups in the Escambray have been captured, killed, escaped or isolated and are no longer a threat. He said [REDACTED] Miami, had information relative to the situation there. Of his own personal knowledge, 70 men of the 30th of November Movement who have been fighting in the Escambray have been isolated by the Castro militia and there does not appear to be any available means to save this group.

b7d) [REDACTED] advised he had [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had been fighting as a counterrevolutionary against CASTRO in the Escambray. He said he and his men had gone to the mountains to fight on the basis

of a promise of assistance from a man who claimed to represent ANTONIO VARONA and the FRD. Such assistance in the form of arms and supplies was never received and his group, which originally numbered about 125 men, was reduced to the point of starvation. He and a few of his men were able to slip through the militia lines during the night and eventually reached the coast, obtained a small boat and made their way to the United States, where they claimed exile.

(b7c)(b7d) [REDACTED] the Castro militia were well armed and trained and proved to be competent soldiers. Until Radio SWAN made broadcasts alleging that more than 4,000 men were in the Escambray fighting, CASTRO had not bothered them. Following the broadcast of this information, however, CASTRO apparently began to worry about the situation in the Escambray and dispatched a large group of militia to the Escambray. On three separate occasions he personally appeared, serving as a boost for the morale of the militia.

(b7c)(b7d) He advised the estimate that there were 4,000 counter-revolutionaries in the Escambray was grossly exaggerated, although he did not know the exact numerical strength. In his opinion, there is no effective fighting force of counter-revolutionaries now in the Escambray. [REDACTED] when he left the Escambray, all of the strategic positions had been occupied by Castro militia to prevent additional counter-revolutionary groups from obtaining control of these positions.

This article described the 30th of November Movement as one of the most outstanding clandestine organizations in action against CASTRO and said that the national coordinator of the group had recently arrived in Miami using the name "ALEJANDRO". The article said that upon interview, ALEJANDRO described the organization as an independent group representing the various sectors of the Cuban population, including workers, students, farmers, professional men, and business and industrial men. He said that the organization was also cooperating with the other revolutionary organizations in Cuba, with the objective of overthrowing the Communist Government and re-establishing Cuba within the orbit of the western democracies.

It is noted that the January 19, 1961, issue of "Diario las Americas" carried a paid political announcement which was captioned "The Committee in Exile of the 30th of November Movement Declares:". This announcement advised that the committee in exile of the Movement had not been able to verify the permanent position in the organization which had been attributed to RAUL RODRIGUEZ (ALEJANDRO) and which also stated that the committee in exile could not continue to recognize RAUL RODRIGUEZ as the

foreign coordinator of the Movement and that, accordingly, he had not been in any way authorized to enter into any pacts or agreements with any other revolutionary organization. It was also requested that no economic assistance be given to anyone not completely authorized by the organization.

The March 30, 1961, issue of the "Diario Las Americas" contained a paid political announcement which was captioned "The 30th of November Movement to Cuba:". This announcement was signed with the following seven names:

CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA - in charge
ORLANDO RODRIGUEZ - in charge of organization
FELIX EQUES - public relations
JESUS FERNANDEZ - military matters
LUIS MORENO - in charge of labor
JOSE ROMERO - in charge of farm labor
ROBERTO ARMAND - in charge of finances

The article related that "we" came to Miami at the call of the Revolutionary Democratic Front to serve the national cause. It was stated that "we define our present stand as follows: We are supporting in every way, absolutely and enthusiastically, the elected president of the Revolutionary Council, Dr. JOSE MIRO CARDONA, designated by the various groups and personalities which compromise the executive committee of the Revolutionary Democratic Front. We also support, in the same way, the council and the government he selects." The article went on to say that the 30th of November Movement was completely anti-Communist and in favor of the re-establishment of the Cuban Constitution of 1940. The announcement indicated that it had been signed in Miami by the above mentioned men on the 28th of May, 1961.

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

Dear Sir:

We are writing to you with a sense of responsibility and respect as Cubans who have witnessed the disappearance of our most fundamental freedoms while our Country was delivered into the hands of a foreign system which, among other things, is totalitarian and contrary to our conception of free and sovereign men.

It should be noted that when we joined the struggle against communism within our Country, we did so without any help from the outside. However, as this struggle reached its ruthless climax, we came face to face with the fact that we were not only engaged in a battle with the bad Cubans who betrayed the postulates of our Independence, but, also, had to contend with an enemy of which we knew something, but the full extent of whose evil and ruthlessness was unknown to us: the powerful apparatus of international communism, now entrenched in Cuba and fully organized in all its deadly efficiency. Faced with this reality, we turned our eyes full of hope and faith toward the sister nations of Latin America and we said to ourselves: "Once the Cuban reality becomes known, the rest of America will not remain indifferent and it will be a matter of a few months for us to see our sister nations raise their voice and accusing finger against Castro-communism." Yet, as our struggle dragged on, we suffered many disappointments, or, rather, frustrations, because of the apathetic attitude and sheer ignorance of the Cuban problem on the part of those who could do so much.

It is for the above reasons, dear Mr. President, that we are writing to you. We are making an appeal not to your conscience as a statesman, but to your sentiments as a free man whose future development lies within the things which a human being loves and appreciates the most: Liberty and Democracy.

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We were dealt a very hard blow indeed when we learned that certain countries were opposed to considering the great tragedy which has befallen our Country within the Organization of American States. However, much harder and much more destructive will be the blow that the future judgment of the free men of the entire world will deal to those who, because of fear or weakness, refused to listen to the cry of anguish and distress of an entire nation. The right of self-determination was pleaded as a cover for apathy even though everybody is fully aware that in communist Cuba the only self-determination which exists lies at the foot of the wall of the firing squad executions.

May God will that those who today are the advocates of nonintervention never suffer in their own flesh the consequences of the intervention of international communism as the Cuban people suffer them today.

We do not wish to tell anybody what they have to do - we are no statesmen - but we wish to call to your attention that there is still time to rescue Cuba from the claws of the red beast. Cuba's rescue means the preservation of the hemisphere.

This is our final and unchanging call: "Presidents of the various American Republics, awaken those who are still asleep; strip the blindfold from those who do not wish to see. The historical judgment on taking a stand is at the door: either with communism or against communism."

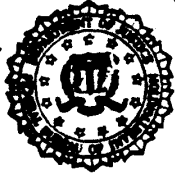

An article appeared in the "Dallas Morning News," a daily Dallas newspaper, dated 2/12/62, which reflected that a FRANCISCO LEIVA, who claimed to have been a member of the Cuban Revolutionary Army's underground forces who recently fled Cuba less than a month ago after his underground activities made him a top candidate for CASTRO's firing squad, in Dallas, Texas, living with his brother, DELFIN LEIVA, another Cuban exile. Both individuals claimed to have been in the unsuccessful invasion of Cuba in April of 1961, FRANCISCO being a member of the resistance army inside Cuba.

According to this article, FRANCISCO LEIVA proudly displayed a letter of introduction from the Cuban Government in exile giving him orders to organize Cuban patriots in this area for the exiles newest movement, "El 30 de Noviembre," the successor to FIDEL CASTRO's "26 de Julio" movement. This organization has ten sections currently operating in Cuba with espionage and sabotage networks scattered throughout the island.

Unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau, Dallas Office will contact FRANCISCO LEIVA to determine the extent of his organizing of captioned organization. Dallas will also contact established Cuban sources regarding captioned organization.

The Miami Office is requested to furnish the Dallas Office with any information regarding this organization.

Jose Miro Cardona, head of the anti-Castro Revolutionary Council, recently expelled delegates from the 30th of November Movement and the 20th of May Movement because they supported demonstrations in Miami which Cardona believed endanger relations between anti-Castro front and U.S. Both organizations are members of the Cuban Revolutionary Council and anti-Castro. Attached translation deals with this dispute and particularly the stand of the 30th of November Movement.

TO PUBLIC OPINION IN EXILE

The Diario de las Americas published a communique of the Cuban Revolutionary Council in which an effort is made to explain the removal of the delegates representing the November 30 and the May 20 Movements.

The November 30 Movement does not have the financial means that would make it possible to publish and disseminate a declaration that would destroy the accumulation of lies contained in the communique. For the time being, it will confine itself to the clearing up of certain aspects of this question, hoping to be able to acquaint the Cuban people through subsequent releases of information with the true reasons which have led Dr. Miro to adopt such a drastic attitude against two Cubans whose only crime is to have served their country in a most worthy and lofty manner.

When the time comes, the November 30 Movement will impugn as an illegal step the decision expelling the two Movements. This is so, because such a decision violated in a most serious fashion the precepts governing the Council's Statute and By-Laws as well as certain universal principles of the Law of Impeachment.

Dr. Miro is endeavoring to bring disorientation among the Cubans and among the Americans themselves. He is in obvious bad faith when he tries to make it appear as though Messrs. Rodriguez Quesada and Sota are attacking our allies. The November 30 Movement most categorically rejects such a deceitful statement whose only purpose can be an attempt at sowing enmity between the Government of the United States of America and the November 30 and May 20 Movements. Dr. Miro knows perfectly well that this accusation is devoid of any foundation. In reality, he is worried about the results of the Referendum which the November 30 Movement is conducting among the Cubans in exile. He is keenly aware that the Cubans do not want him as their Provisional President. In fact, they realize that he lacks the requisites of capacity, honesty, conduct and patriotism which the position makes indispensable and, also, they know, because it is a matter of public knowledge, that everything he does is guided by his unmistakable desire to remain at the top even if this makes it necessary to destroy the very foundation upon which the fight against the Cuban brand of communism must rest. And this foundation, as everybody knows, is unity of understanding among all Cubans.

It is because of this that the communique points out Question No. 5 and Question No. 6 of the Referendum as the reasons which prompted the leadership of the Council to expel the two representatives. In fact, Question No. 5 is designed to find out from the Cubans in exile which is the person who, in their opinion, is capable of uniting all Cubans in a joint effort for the prompt liberation of their country. Question No. 6 is designed to find out whether the Cubans in exile believe that the Cuban Revolutionary Council is taking effective steps to wage war against Cuba.

In the eyes of Dr. Miro the effort of the November 30 Movement to probe public opinion on the subject of such vital problems as those dealt with in those two questions is a capital crime against our country. Yet, the Cubans are those who must have the last say in a truly democratic way about these matters. Apparently, allegiance to the democratic principles which have been the pillar of our government and for the defense of which many Cubans have died, are dying now and will continue to die in the future, is a crime of high treason according to the policies that Dr. Miro is trying to impose upon the Council. At all times, these policies have been fought by our Organization. The only thing in which Dr. Miro is interested is to keep himself in power at all costs. On one occasion, Dr. Miro let his unconfessed thirst for power get the upper hand and in an outburst of uncontrolled conceit exclaimed, in the very Council over which he presides and in the presence of several witnesses, that on the day that he enters Cuba with the "Marines" he will have all those who oppose the measures adopted by his Government executed by the firing squad. It is this conceit which led him

to attack and divide the revolutionary organizations whose leaders did not bow to his policies of personal aggrandizement. In his efforts, he sowed confusion among and within the organizations, bringing into the Council the men who gave him assurance that they would be the abject and obedient rubber stamps approving the dictates of him who believes himself all-powerful because of the unlimited resources at his disposal.

These very same policies are now being implemented against the November 30 Movement. The communique announces that Dr. Miro is sending two messages to Havana, Cuba, instructing the leadership to replace the delegates he wants expelled. This communique is one more proof of the underhanded, sly and unscrupulous conduct of this politician who does not work for Cuba but for his personal interest. In fact, on the question of the replacements in Cuba, all requests should be addressed to the delegation in exile, because it was the delegation in exile and not the leadership in Havana which designated Mr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada as its delegate within Council.

In effect, in full compliance with a requirement of the Cuban Revolutionary Council Statute, the November 30 Movement in Exile submitted to the Secretary of the Council a certified list of the people making up its leadership and the credentials of Mr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada as its representative within the Council. On the basis of these documents, the Council approved the delegate and his credentials, thereby recognizing the right of the November 30 Movement in Exile to appoint such a delegate within the Council. That being the case, why is Dr. Miro asking for a replacement of Mr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada by an organization other than the one which originally appointed him? Why is he turning to Cuba in open disavowal of a personality and right which he had previously recognized? The answer is obvious and clear. Dr. Miro is again busy with his efforts to cause a split within our organization for the purpose of taking into the Council a man of dissident opinions (such as there always is in any organization) who will act as the subservient executor of his orders.

Lastly, in view of the fact that the referendum is not being conducted by Carlos Rodriguez Quesada, but by the November 30 Revolutionary Movement in Exile, why does Dr. Miro expell Mr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada and not the organization which bears the ultimate responsibility for desecrating his unbounded ambition? The reply is once again obvious and clear. Dr. Miro wishes to convey the impression that the November 30 Movement remains in the Council when, in reality, if his scheme is to succeed, there will only remain a spineless lackey. altogether inept to oppose his dictates.

Once again, mankind witnesses a David versus Goliath match. This time, the honor of playing David's role belongs to us. We are the humble, honest shepherd who is a giant only in moral strength, while Mr. Miro Cardona is a Goliath who derives immense strength from the resources available to him, but who is a dwarf in his mind and in his sentiments toward his country.

En el Diario de las Américas aparece publicado un Manifiesto del Consejo Revolucionario Cubano, tratando de explicar la destitución de los delegados del 30 de Noviembre y 20 de Mayo.

El 30 de Noviembre no cuenta con recursos económicos para publicar una declaración a toda plana destruyendo el cúmulo de mentiras que contiene ese Manifiesto. Mr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada addresses the Cuban Revolutionary Council to have the decision expelling him from the Council as the Delegate of the November 30 Revolutionary Movement set aside on the grounds that certain rules were overlooked as well as some fundamental principles of the Council's Right to Judge (sic).

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Secondly, maintains Quesada, a more fundamentally universal and civilized law was violated: that law which states that no one shall be judged without being heard.

Thirdly, Quesada states that another universal legal principle was violated: that which states that no one can be judge and litigant in the same trial. He explains that Dr. Jose Miro Cardona acted both as judge and litigant inasmuch as it was he who brought the charges to bear, while still presiding over the Tribunal as judge.

Quesada states that he feels the violation of these basic principles of necessity absolutely nullify the decision made. He requests that the Council recognize this.

Quesada states that a further violation of the Council's norms and principles was committed when it was proposed that he be immediately replaced at the same meeting.

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Quesada repeats his request that the decision expelling him be nullified and signs the document, which is dated March 19, 1962, in Miami.

The Council is further accused of letting down its undercover men in Cuba.

H E C H O S

1o. FUNDAMENTOS DE DERECHO

"Salvo casos extraordinarios, se debera entregar o remitir al domicilio de cada Consejero el orden del dia de las sesiones ordinarias o extraordinarias de modo que la reciban con un dia de anticipacion por lo menos a la fecha y hora de la sesion respectiva y, con dicha salvedad, se deberan tratar en ellas solamente los asuntos comprendidos en el orden del dia, en el que deberan figurar los asuntos propuestos por los Consejeros con la debida anticipacion."

En nuestro caso, se redactó y remitió a las organizaciones revolucionarias la -

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orden del día confeccionada para ser discutida en la sesión del día 13 de marzo - del año en curso, por lo que no rige la excepción o salvedad que establece ese precepto.

Al disponer ese artículo que en las sesiones que celebre el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba " se deberán tratar solamente los asuntos comprendidos en la orden del día ", esta plasmando, elevándolo al rango de norma de obligatorio cumplimiento, uno de los principios esenciales que informa todo Procedimiento, cual es el de lealtad en el debate, incorporado a los Estatutos o leyes orgánicas de las sociedades o asociaciones de todo orden, en cuanto a las convocatorias y ulterior desenvolvimiento de las sesiones se contrae.

Esa norma tiene como finalidad indisputable ofrecer la adecuada protección a los accionistas, socios o asociados o miembros de cualquier clase en el desarrollo de las sesiones de los órganos deliberantes de las instituciones de que forman parte, ya que trata de impedir situaciones de indefensión, que se produzcan como ha ocurrido en el caso en examen si no se consignaran en el orden del día de las convocatorias los asuntos que han de tratarse en las respectivas sesiones, puesto que, de ocurrir esa anómala situación, los asistentes se verían forzados a improvisar la defensa de sus intereses en el propio instante en que se sometiera a discusión y votación un asunto del cual no habían tenido previo conocimiento.

La transgresión de esa norma fundamental del Procedimiento conlleva en forma insoslayable la nulidad del acto o acuerdo adoptado en perjuicio de los que resulten afectados por el mismo.

En nuestro caso, el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba ha infringido el precepto de su Reglamento orgánico que se esgrime en este escrito como soporte legal de la nulidad que se insta, que recoge el principio ya mencionado, puesto que habiendo figurado como único asunto de la orden del día confeccionada para ser discutida en la sesión del día 13 de marzo de 1962, el informe del Presidente al Consejo, sin especificarse siquiera la materia sobre la cual habría de versar ese informe, el Consejo, apartándose y desconociendo esa orden del día, entro a conocer de cuestión ajena a la misma, como fue el enjuiciamiento y destitución del Sr. Carlos Rodríguez Quesada.-

SEGUNDO: El principio universal de derecho, recogido en las Constituciones de los pueblos civilizados, según el cual, nadie debe ser juzgado sin ser oído.

Ese principio fue violado igualmente por el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba en el acuerdo que se impugna, pues no cabe dudas que desde el momento en que el Sr.

Este principio tambien ha sido violado por el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba, si se tiene en cuenta que en el Tribunal que juzgo y sanciono al Sr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada, figuro el doctor Jose Miro Cardona como juez y parte, por cuanto - que fue el quien formulo los cargos, haciendo las veces de Fiscal, a la vez que presidio el propio Tribunal, actuando como juez, con manifiesto y evidente desprecio - a uno de los principios que norman el Derecho de Enjuiciar en los paises civilizados.

La violacion de los principios y preceptos que se han consignado, llevan consigo, como obligado y forzoso conseqüencia, la nulidad absoluta del acuerdo que se - impugna, el cual, por ende, carece de efecto y valor alguno, como asi debe reconocerlo y declararlo ese Consejo.

Los fundamentos que sirven de sustentacion juridica a la solicitud de nulidad que se esgrime son de aplicacion en el supuesto de que se quiera sostener que en la sesion del dia 13 de marzo ya mencionada se ratifico la decision del Presidente del Consejo de solicitar la sustitucion inmediata del Sr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada, por cuanto que aquel no fue convocado, ni en la orden del dia confeccionada - para ser tratada en esa sesion figuro como asunto esa cuestion, lo cual, por lo - tanto, no pudo discutirse validamente.

Por otra parte, es indudable que aun en ese propio supuesto, el Consejo adopto el acuerdo de respaldo a la decision del Presidente - lo que se acepta solamente en gracias a la argumentacion - con vista a los cargos que aquel formulo en contra del Sr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada, con lo cual el Consejo se erigio en Tribunal disciplinario e impuso la sancion solicitada por el doctor Miro Cardona, violando evidentemente, las normas y principios invocados.

POR TANTO

AL CONSEJO REVOLUCIONARIO DE CUBA solicito: que habiendo por presentado este - escrito y en su merito decretar, en definitiva, la absoluta nulidad del acuerdo adoptado por el mismo en sesion celebrada el dia 13 del mes de marzo de 1962, mediante el cual expulso, separo, destituyo o solicito la sustitucion del Sr. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada del cargo de Delegado del Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre - ante ese propio Consejo.

El que suscribe, Carlos Rodríguez Quesada, mayor de edad, cubano, casado, refugiado político y vecino de 1859 N.W. 42nd St., en mi carácter de Coordinador General y a nombre y en representación del Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre, con domicilio social en la Cuarta Avenida No. 427, del Suroeste de Miami, todo lo cual consta acreditado en los archivos generales de ese Consejo, ante el mismo comparezco y digo:

1o. Que en alocución dirigida por el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba "A los Cubanos", que apareció publicada en la edición del Diario de las Américas correspondiente al día 15 de Marzo de 1962, se informa que ese organismo respaldó por unanimidad la decisión tomada por su Presidente de solicitar a la organización revolucionaria 30 de Noviembre la sustitución inmediata del Sr. Carlos Rodríguez Quesada como Delegado de la misma ante el Consejo.

2o. Según consta debidamente acreditado en los archivos generales del Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba, en cumplimiento de lo prevenido en el artículo 29 de su Reglamento orgánico, el Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre entregó en Secretaría de ese propio Consejo, con fecha 12 de Octubre de 1961 copia certificada del Acta contentiva del Acuerdo adoptado por el Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre designando al Sr. Carlos Rodríguez Quesada Delegado de esa Organización ante el Consejo, como representante de la misma, y de las personas que integran el Comité Ejecutivo.

Los abajo firmantes, integrantes del Comité Ejecutivo del Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre, ante el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba comparecen y dicen:

1o. Que durante el desarrollo de la sesión celebrada el día 13 del mes de marzo de 1962 por ese Consejo, nuestro delegado señor Carlos Rodríguez Quesada hizo constar la necesidad de la reestructuración de ese Organismo a base de la sustitución de su presidente doctor José Miro Cardona, y expuso, además, que el 30 de Noviembre no volvería al Consejo mientras permaneciera en su cargo el doctor Miro Cardona.

2o. Al producirse en esa forma, el señor Carlos Rodríguez Quesada no lo hizo obrando por iniciativa propia, ni actuando por sí, sino en cumplimiento de acuerdo adoptado por la dirigencia del 30 de Noviembre en 12 del propio mes de marzo, que descansa en las razones siguientes:

a) La labor disolvente y evidentemente personalista, encaminada a sostenerse en la presidencia del Consejo, que no fue creado para dar satisfacción a apetitos de mando o de poder, sino para llevar la guerra de liberación a Cuba.

En la prosecución de sus desorbitadas ambiciones de control absoluto del Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba como paso previo para el salto a la Presidencia Provisional de la República a la caída del Fidelato, el doctor Miro Cardona ha acudido a todos los procedimientos y seguido cuantas vías ha sido menester, sin parar mientes en la índole de unas u otras.

Esa ha sido la razón de ser de su política agresiva frente a quienes osen discrepar de su criterio, que lo han llevado a practicar el divisionismo entre las organizaciones revolucionarias cuyas dirigencias no se le han sometido incondicionalmente, para traer al Consejo como representantes de aquellas, a los elementos disidentes que él apoya, como ha sucedido con el Demócrata Cristiano, y está tratando de llevar adelante con el 30 de Noviembre.

La dirigencia de nuestra Organización ha estado plenamente informada en todo tiempo de las frecuentes entrevistas sostenidas por el doctor Miro Cardona con algunos elementos disidentes con miras al control del 30 de Noviembre.

Con la misma finalidad dedica a los llamados activistas, según las Nomins del Consejo, a realizar labores de desacreditación en la calle en contra de aquellos delegados y organizaciones que no ha podido controlar.

b) Porque despues de solicitar de las organizaciones revolucionarias que situaran a sus hombres del claudestinaje en Cuba a fin de enviarles pertrechos de guerra explosivos y demas elementos para las labores de sabotaje, no cumplieron su promesa, provocando la destruccion de muchas de nuestras fuerzas.

c) Porque en vez de ir a la integracion de un organismo obrero dentro del Consejo, que este integrado por los sectores obreros de las distintas organizaciones revolucionarias, le ha dado entrada al FORDC, formado por dirigentes de ese sector, que representan solamente una fraccion del sector obrero apartandose de lo que dispone el Reglamento organico del Consejo, segun el cual, este es el organismo de unidad de los sectores de las organizaciones revolucionarias que operan en Cuba.

Lo propio ha sucedido con el sector estudiantil, puesto que otorgo la representacion en el Consejo de ese sector al Directorio Estudiantil, prescindiendo de los sectores estudiantiles de las organizaciones revolucionarias.

Es de subrayarse, que el Directorio Estudiantil acaba de abandonar el Consejo Revolucionario de Cuba por discrepancias con este.

Las clases economicas, campesina; el sector militar y la Prensa se han negado a formar parte del Consejo, porque en vez de constituir el doctor Miro Cardona los respectivos organos encargados de recomendar la politica a seguir en cada caso, segun el sector, se ha limitado a designar personas que no actuan ni pueden realizar ninguna de esas actividades por la ausencia del vehiculo que pudiera viabilizar las mismas.

d) Porque resulta evidente que la politica seguida por el doctor Miro Cardona desde la presidencia del Consejo ha resultado contraproducente a los fines y propósitos que le dieron vida, por cuanto que en vez de unir a los cubanos en la lucha de liberacion frente al enemigo comun: el Comunismo, ha creado la suspicacia, el recelo y el divisionismo entre las organizaciones revolucionarias y entre los propios cubanos, produciendo el antagonismo y dispersion de las fuerzas que deben marchar unidas si quieren derrotar al enemigo de Cuba, de las Americas y de la propia Humanidad.

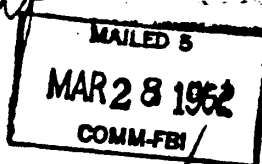

Recently Cardona expelled Quesada from the Council because Quesada supported demonstrations in Miami which Cardona believed endangered relations between anti-Castro front and U.S. Enclosure to reairtel set forth results of interview with Quesada on 3-15-62 at which time Quesada advised us of his differences with Cardona. During interview Quesada indicated he intended to write various people and agencies including Bureau explaining his position and justifying his actions. We have disseminated this data. 3-21-62 letter apparently is letter previously mentioned by Quesada which he indicated he would circulate.

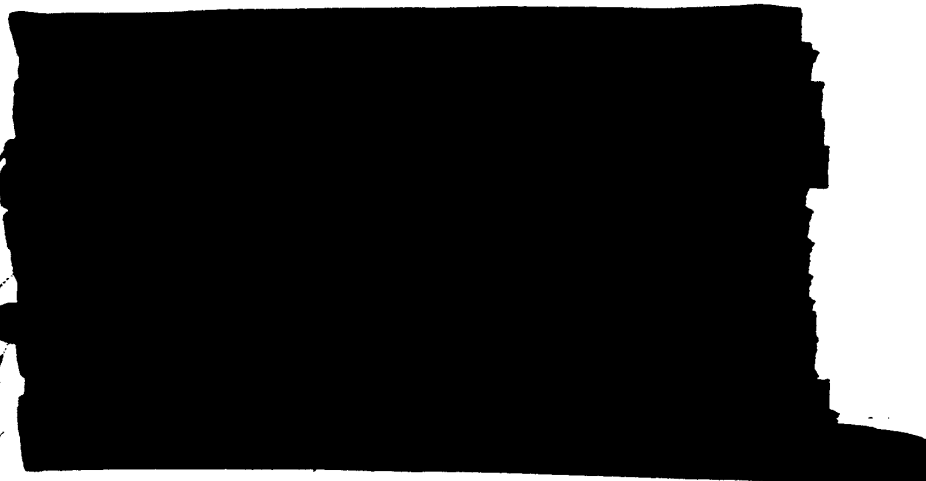

According to [REDACTED] the 30th of November Movement is an anti-Castro organization, which is affiliated with the Cuban Revolutionary Council with its headquarters in Miami, Florida.

According to [REDACTED] CRUZ (b7d) and his movement plan to picket the Mexican Consulate at 12 South Twelfth Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on Saturday, December 16, 1961, to protest Mexico's action in the Organization of American States by not condemning FIDEL CASTRO.

[REDACTED] (b7d)

On December 14, 1961, the Philadelphia Police Department advised it received a letter, dated December 14, 1961, from ELIO CRUZ, representative, "30 de Novembre Movement," 4908 Lancaster Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The letter indicated that the Cuban Movement of November 30th, represented by Mr. ELIO CRUZ, asked permission from the Police Department to have a picket line at the Mexican Consulate on Saturday, December 16, 1961, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The letter advised that, "All our movements in Latin America will be following these instructions to picket the Mexican Consulates in their respective countries at this time for its cooperation with FIDEL CASTRO." The letter concluded with the statement that there would be about fifty persons in the picket line.

On December 15, 1961, the files of the Philadelphia Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service were checked by Special Employee [REDACTED] and they failed to reflect any information concerning ELIO CRUZ. (b7c)

On December 18, 1961, [REDACTED] (b7d) advised that on December 16, 1961, approximately twelve individuals, representing the 30th of November Movement of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, picketed the Office of the Mexican

Consulate, 12 South Twelfth Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. These individuals were led by ELIO CRUZ, who recently arrived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from Miami, Florida. The group was protesting Mexico's action in the Organization of American States for its failure to condemn FIDEL CASTRO.

[REDACTED] advised that the 30th of November Movement also sent out mimeographed copies of a letter addressed to ADOLFO LOPEZ MATEOS, President of Mexico, criticizing him for ordering his representative in the Organization of American States to align himself with Cuba. The letter declared that the Mexican Government could not deny affiliation with Communism, and called the President a Communist and a traitor. The letter was signed by ELIO CRUZ, Coordinator of the 30th of November Movement, and CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADO, Coordinator General in Exile of the 30th of November Movement.

On January 2, 1962, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that the 30th of November Movement was originally founded by MANUEL ARTIME, and was composed largely of Catholic students in Cuba. He declared that the 30th of November was the date on which HUBER MATOS, former military commander of Camaguey Province in Cuba, was arrested by FIDEL CASTRO and sentenced to thirty years in prison for being a traitor to the Cuban Revolution.

On January 9, 1962, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] CRUZ and the 30th of November organization met every Sunday at 2:00 p.m. in the vicinity of Fifteenth and Green Streets, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

On February 27, 1962, [REDACTED] advised that the 30th of November Movement in Philadelphia was relatively inactive, but met for social purposes every Sunday at 1528 Green Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in the United Church of Christ. (b7d)

[REDACTED] this Movement is led in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, by ELIO CRUZ, who was outspoken in his criticism of the CASTRO Movement.

On March 19, 1962, ELIO CRUZ advised Special Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that he was the nominal leader of the 30th of November Movement, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, which was originally founded in Cuba as an anti-CASTRO organization. He declared that the headquarters of the 30th of November Movement is presently in Miami, Florida, but that this organization has been inactive in Philadelphia since it picketed the Mexican Consulate on December 16, 1961. (b7c)

CRUZ stated that there are approximately eight individuals in Philadelphia who are sympathetic toward the aims and purposes of the 30th of November Movement.

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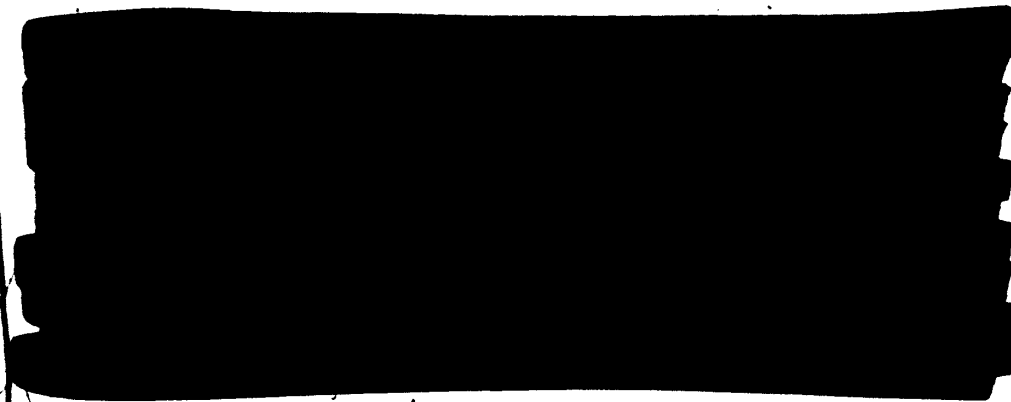

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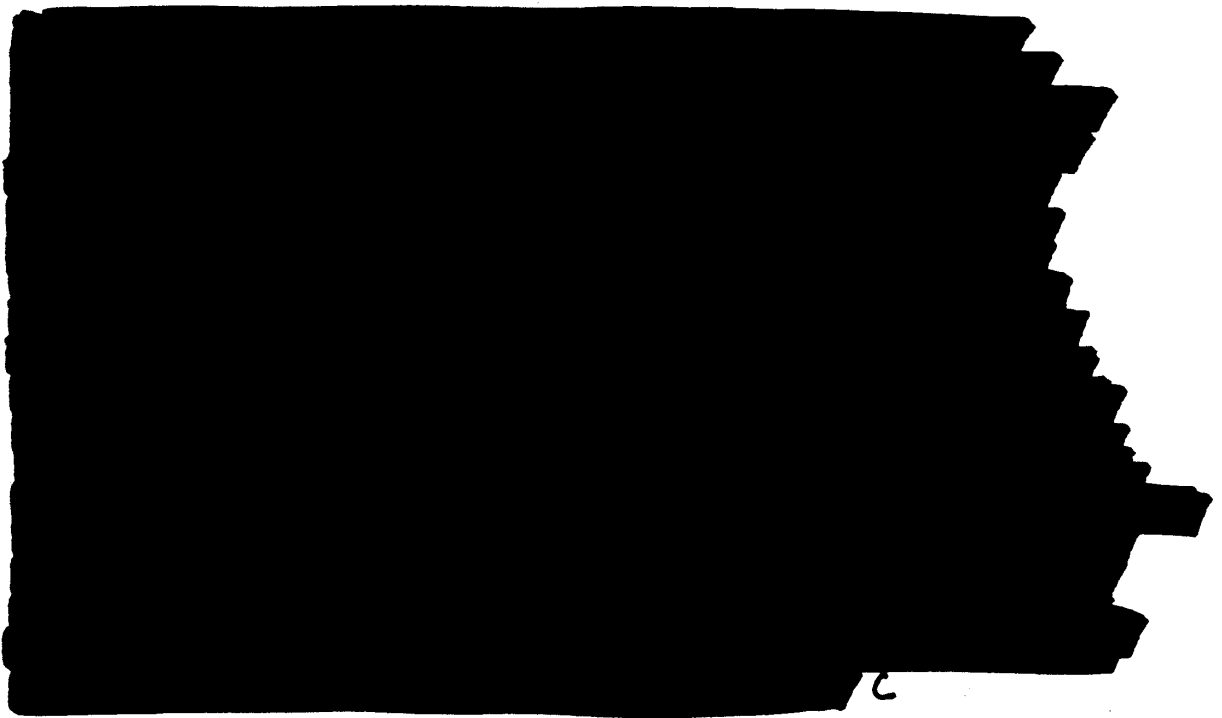

DETAILS:

I. PREDICATION

(b7c) On February 28, 1961, CESAR BLANCO GUTIERREZ was interviewed at his place of employment. [REDACTED]

He stated that he had come to the United States on September 29, 1960, with a letter from DAVID SALVADOR, the head of the 30th of November Movement in Cuba, which designated him, BLANCO, as the foreign representative of that organization. He said that at the time he arrived in the United States, he was the only member of the group in this country.

II. HEADQUARTERS

On March 15, 1962, CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA, General Coordinator of the 30th of November Revolutionary Movement, advised that the headquarters of this organization was located at 427 S. W. 4th Avenue, Miami, Florida. [REDACTED]

III. ORIGIN

On October 21, 1961, CESAR BLANCO GUTIERREZ, previously mentioned, made available a memorandum which he had prepared regarding his activities in the revolutionary movement in Cuba, both prior and subsequent to the advent to power of FIDEL CASTRO in January, 1959. In this memorandum, BLANCO stated that the 30th of November Movement was named for the date of the uprising led by FRANK PAIS (deceased) in Santiago, Cuba, in November,

1956. He stated that the leader of this movement was ~~DAVID SALVADOR~~, formerly Secretary General of the Confederation of Workers of Cuba during the first year of the CASTRO regime. He stated that SALVADOR had resigned in opposition to the Communist penetration of the regime.

IV. LEADERSHIP-IN THE UNITED STATES

As previously mentioned, CESAR BLANCO GUTIERREZ identified himself as the first representative in the United States of this organization.

On February 15, 1961, ~~RAUL RODRIGUEZ~~, 1250 S. W. 6th Street, Miami, advised that he had come to the United States from Cuba on January 28, 1961, for the purpose of organizing the 30th of November Movement in Miami, and indicated that he was the authorized representative of the group in the United States.

On February 28, 1961, CESAR BLANCO GUTIERREZ, previously mentioned, advised that the March 3, 1961, issue of "Avance," which he described as a Spanish language weekly, anti-CASTRO newspaper, had identified ~~JESUS FERNANDEZ~~, ~~ORLANDO RODRIGUEZ~~ and ~~FELIX EGUES~~ as leaders of the 30th of November Movement. BLANCO stated that FERNANDEZ was an executive of the Federation of Electric Plants in Cuba, and had arrived in Miami several months previously.

On March 9, 1961, CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA appeared at the Miami Office of the FBI and advised

that he had recently arrived in Miami from Cuba, having been designated General Coordinator of the 30th of November Movement to replace RAUL RODRIGUEZ.

The March 30, 1961, issue of "Diario Las Americas" contained a paid political announcement captioned, "The 30th of November Movement to Cuba." This announcement was signed with the following seven names:

It is to be noted that the "Miami Herald" of March 14, 1962, page 1A, carried an item reflecting that 152 men and women, Cuban refugees, who had been arrested at 2:30 A.M., March 13, 1962, by Miami police, after a Bay Front Park hunger strike, had been released on bond the same day. The article also related that a rally

attended by 2,500 Cuban refugees was held at the Bay Front Park bandshell, also on March 13, 1962. The refugees, who had been jailed earlier, "were paraded on the stage to the loud cheers of the refugees." It was stated that the speakers called for the immediate resignation of MIRO CARDONA, for the refugees to return their relief checks, and "ask for arms instead."

[REDACTED] the "hunger strike" had been organized and staged by LAUREANO BATISTA FALLA representing a splinter group of the Christian Democratic Movement. BATISTA, not related to the former Cuban dictator, called on Cuban refugees in Miami to join him and his followers in this strike, protesting the lack of activity on the part of the Revolutionary Council and the failure of the United States Government to furnish the Cuban refugees with the means of overthrowing the Communist regime in Cuba. 445

He stated the governing body of the 30th of November Movement considered BATISTA's request and voted to support the "hunger strike." Approximately thirty members of the 30th of November Movement joined the strikers of BATISTA in the Miami Bay Front Park.

The following article appeared in the March 17, 1962, issue of "Diario Las Americas":

"'Diario Las Americas' printed a manifesto by the Cuban Revolutionary Council, trying to explain the expulsion of the May 20th and November 30th delegates.

"The November 30th Movement does not have sufficient economic resources to publish a lengthy statement destroying the web of lies contained in this Manifesto. We will limit ourselves to clarifying certain aspects of this question, with the hope that later on we can make known to all Cubans the true reasons behind the drastic action by Dr. MIRO against two Cubans whose only crime was to serve their country.

"At the proper time, the November 30th will attack this expulsion as illegal and a violation of the rules of the Council.

"Dr. MIRO is trying to confuse the Cubans, as well as the Americans, when, with obvious bad faith, he tries to make it seem that Messrs. RODRIGUEZ QUESADA and SOTO were attacking our allies. The 30th of November rejects this charge, made only to turn the United States Government against the November 30th group and the May 20th group. Dr. MIRO knows perfectly well that this accusation is untrue. His real reason for this expulsion is the questionnaire which the November 30th Movement is circulating among the exiles, because he knows very well that the Cubans do not want him as provisional president. However, he wishes to hold on to his power, at whatever cost.

"That is why the manifesto dwells on Questions 5 and 6 of the questionnaire as the reasons for expulsion. Question 5 is trying to find out what the exiles think of the possibility of unifying all Cubans to liberate our country. Question 6 concerns opinions as to whether or not the Cuban Revolutionary Council is acting effectively to bring war to Cuba. To Dr. MIRO, it is a crime for the November 30th group to feel the pulse of public opinion in exile. Since Dr. MIRO will not tolerate opinions other than his own, he has tried to divide the revolutionary organizations whose leaders would

"not bend to his will, thus sowing confusion among the exiles. He wants as members of the Council people who will obey his orders without question.

"That is why he has turned against the November 30th group. In the manifesto itself, the statement is made that Dr. MIRO is sending two couriers to Havana so that the directors in Cuba may name substitutes for the delegates expelled by him. He shows himself here to be an intriguer, since he should ask the organization in Miami to name these delegates. Obviously, he is working only for his personal interests.

"It was the delegation in Miami which named CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA as their representative; therefore, it should be the group in Miami which names a substitute. Dr. MIRO is trying to split the organization and bring to the Council someone who will carry out his orders without question.

"This questionnaire was not the work of Mr. CARLOS RODRIGUEZ QUESADA; it was the work of the entire organization. Why didn't Dr. MIRO expel the entire group? Because he wants to give the impression that the group is remaining with the Council, represented by a servile lackey, incapable of opposing his orders."

The article was signed by the Executive Committee for the 30th of November Movement.

The March 20, 1962, issue of "Diario Las Americas" carried a paid political announcement captioned, "To the Cuban Exiles." A review of this announcement reflects that it is a protest against recent activities performed in the name of the 30th of November Revolutionary Movement, including the referendum, the "Hunger Strike" in Bay Front Park, and the removal of the delegate of the organization to the Revolutionary Council. It was stated that the 30th of November Movement is opposed to the provocation of disputes affecting public order in the U. S. where "we have been humanely accepted." It states that their fight is to erase Communism from their country and that such activities as the referendum do nothing more than create more division as a result of personal ambitions. The statement is signed by some 85 individuals, including JESUS FERNANDEZ and ORLANDO RODRIGUEZ. In addition, there appeared the following:

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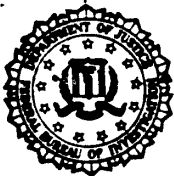

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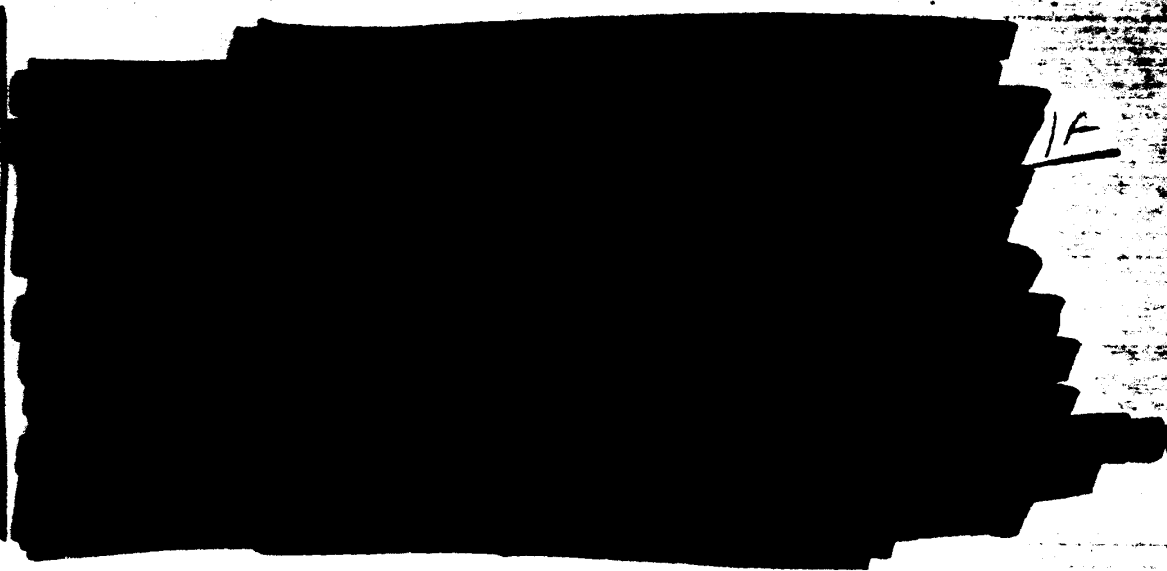

Those who bear the responsibility for this situation are men without patriotic dignity and morals who, by political cunning, have set themselves up as the representatives of the Cuban cause before the eyes of the peoples and nations of this continent, but have done so behind the back of Cuba. To them, Cuba is not a country to be loved, but a pedestal for their personal ambitions. With unpatriotic skill, they have succeeded in dividing the Revolutionary Organizations, they have lied again and again with the allurements of dates and promises, they have promised supplies and resources in order to prevent the formation of a united bloc of all Cubans that would be able to represent the Cuba which fights and dies.
