2 Members Of Rivero Group Held In Bombing Of Office

Two Cuban refugees were in Dade County jail today on \$50,000 bond each, charged with bombing the headquarters of an organization opposing last week's one-day strike over the arrest of Felipe Rivero.

Arrested Monday were Julio Pestonit, 29, of 6201 SW 14th St., and Everisto Ignacio Garcia Jr., 26, of 4001 SW 5th St.

They are accused of "placing a lethal device, namely a bomb, in a building with intent to do bodily harm and damage" at 1784 W. Flagler St., the office of Cuban Representation in Exile.

Like Rivero, who is also in the jail, they are members of a Cuban nationalist organization which has been linked with anti-Communist bombings in Canada and elsewhere.

Last Tuesday the Cuban Exile Representation office was shattered by the bomb blast, after Ernesto Freyre, its chief, had advised fellow Cubans not to hold a proposed strike to protest Rivero's arrest.

The strike was held anyway.

Before their arrest by Dade County detectives, a deportation hearing for Rivero was postponed at his request. He asked that a habeas corpus hearing scheduled tomorrow in U.S. District Court be held first.

Police said other arrests in connection with the bombing may be forthcoming.
