## Pepper: U.S. shouldn't block exiles' efforts to invade Cuba

U.S. Congressman Claude Pepper, following a meeting with Cuban exile leaders yeslerday, told The Miami News that the United States should not hinder exiles' efforts to conduct raids or to invade Cuban shores.

"If I were the policeman," the Dade Democrat said, "I'd look the other way."

He made the comment in response to claims by Cubans at a rally yesterday that the U.S. Coast Guard has lindered efforts of exites to conduct raids on the Cuban coast.

Pepper made his comments following a brief meeting with some 500 Cohans who had amassed ourside Miani Beach Convention center, where the Democratic Pacty was holding its national convention.
