of the Criminal Court of Record in and for Dade County, Florida, personally appeared E. W. McCRACKEN, Detective Sergeant of the City of Miami Police Department, Dade County, Florida, who being by me first duly sworn deposes and says:

That your affiant executed a search warrant, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, and your affiant executed the affidavit, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, and also executed this search warrant on the premises named within the search warrant. You affiant, while executing the search warrant on the premises located at 921 Southwest 5th Avenue, Miami, Dade County, Florida, which are more particularly described in the affidavits attached hereto, found a substance which your affiant did not know at that time was an explosive. Upon returning to the City of Miami Police Department, your affiant spoke with TOM BRODY, a bomb expert employed by the Public Safety Department of Dade County, Florida. Your affiant described the silver powdered substance in the white plastic container which your affiant saw inside the premises searched at 921 Southwest 5th Avenue, Miami, Dade County, Florida, and was told by OFFICER BRODY that the substance was THERMITE, which is an explosive and is used with the plastic explosive C-4.

WHEREFORE, your affiant prays that a search warrant be issued according to law commanding the City of Miami Police

Department and its duly constituted officers to re-enter the premises

known as 921 Southwest 5th Avenue, Miami, Dade County, Florida, and more particularly described in the affidavits attached hereto, to search for and seize the quantity of the explosive described above.

To the Chief of Police, City of Miami Police Department, Dade County, Florida, and his duly constituted officers:

WHEREAS, Sergeant E. W. McCracker and Officer Alfredo
Bared, both of the City of Miami Police Department, have this day
made oath before me that they have probable cause to believe and
do believe that located in a one story frame dwelling painted light
green in color with dark green trim having a black roof and having
two mailboxes located on the north side of the front door which is
located at 921 Southwest 5th Avenue, Miami, Dade County, Florida,
and which is the structure adjacent to Southwest 5th Avenue, a
quantity of explosives, to-wit: a silver powdered explosive substance
commonly known as THERMITE in a round container, held or possessed
in violation of the laws of the State of Florida. The occupants of
said premises are RICARDO MORALES NAVARETTE and HECTOR M. CORNILLOT.
The premises to be searched is the frame dwelling immediately adjacent
to Southwest 5th Avenue, and the converted unattached garage at the
rear of the premises is specifically excluded from this search warrant.

The undersigned Judge of the Criminal Court of Record in and for Dade County, Florida, expressly finds that there was probable cause for the issuance of this search warrant.

named officers with the proper and necessary assistance, either in the daytime or in the nighttime, as the exigencies of the situation may demand to search the said one story frame dwelling painted light green in color with dark green trim having a black roof with two mailboxes on the north side of the front door and located at 921 Southwest 5th Avenue, Miami, Dade County, Florida, and being the dwelling adjacent to Southwest 5th Avenue, and excluding from search under this warrant the unattached converted garage located at the

rear of the premises, and there to diligently search for a silver powdered explosive substance commonly known as THERMITE in a round container held or possessed in violation of the laws of the State of Florida, and if the same be found to seize and secure the same and to make proper return of these activities under this warrant and to give a proper receipt for the quantity of explosives so found and to deliver a copy of this warrant to the person from whom taken or in whose possession it is found or in the absence of such person to leave said copy in the place where said explosives are found, and you are further directed to bring the explosive and also the body or bodies of the person or persons in the unlawful possession thereof before a Court having jurisdiction of this offense to be disposed of and dealt with according to law. This warrant must be executed within ten days of the issuance thereof.
