

This is in regard to your 15 October 1984 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for information concerning yourself.

For your information, the FOIA authorizes federal agencies to collect fees for records services. We are enclosing, therefore, a fee schedule for your guidance. You will note that we charge search fees, including computer time where indices are computerized, and copying costs for releasable documents.

In accordance with section (e) of the schedule, search fees are assessable even if no records are found or, if found, we determine that they are not releasable. This means you will be charged even if our search results are negative or if it is determined that no information is releasable under the FOIA.

Before we can begin any processing of your request, we must receive your commitment to pay all fees incurred and under the conditions stated above. The search fees for each item in a request are usually about \$100; a more precise fee estimate for your particular request can be obtained if you wish.

However, if you are a United States Citizen or a permanent resident alien you are eligible to apply under the Privacy Act of 1974. The Privacy Act provides that no search fees are to be charged; in addition, the CIA does not charge for duplication of releasable material under the Privacy Act.

In summary, if you are not a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident alien we will need your commitment to pay all search fees. Or, if you are a citizen or a permanent resident alien, we require your notarized statement attesting to that fact.

Public Access to Documents and Records and Declassification Requests

AGENCY: Central Intelligence Agency.

ACTION: Final rule.

EFFECTIVE DATE: November 13, 1980.

§ 1900.25 Fees for records services.

- (a) Search and duplication fees shall be charged according to the schedule set forth in paragraph (c) of this section for services rendered in responding to requests for Agency records under this part. Records shall be furnished without charge or at a reduced rate whenever the Coordinator determines that a waiver or reduction of the charge is in the public interest because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public. Thus, the Coordinator shall determine the existence and extent of any identifiable benefit which would result from furnishing the requested information and he shall consider the following factors in making this determination:
- (1) The public or private character of the information sought;
 - (2) The private interest of the requester;
- (3) The numbers of the public to be benefited:
- (4) The significance of the benefit to the public;
- (5) The usefulness of the information to the public; and
- (6) The quantity of similar or duplicative information already in the public domain. In no case will the assessment of fees be utilized as an obstacle to the disclosure of the requested information. The Coordinator may also waive or reduce the charge whenever he determines that the interest of the government would be served thereby. Fees shall not be charged where they would amount, in the aggregate, for a request, or a series of related requests, to less than \$6. Denials of requests for fee waivers may be appealed by writing to the Executive Secretary of the Information Review Committee, via the Coordinator.
- (b) In order to protect the requester and the Agency from large, unexpected fees, when it is anticipated that the charges will amount to more than \$25, the processing of the request shall be suspended until the requester indicates his willingness to pay. The requester shall be notified and asked for his commitment to pay all reasonable search and duplication fees. At his option, the requester may indicate in advance a dollar limitation to the fees. In such an event, the Coordinator shall initiate a search of the system or systems of records deemed most likely to produce relevant records, instructing the system managers to discontinue the search as soon as the stipulated amount has been expended. Where an advance limit has not been stipulated, the Coordinator may, at his discretion or at the behest of the requester, compile an estimate of the search fees likely to be incurred in processing a request, or of such portion thereof as can readily be estimated. The requester shall be promptly notified of the amount and be asked to approve its expenditure. In those cases where the Coordinator estimates that the fees will be substantial, an advance deposit of 50 percent of the estimated fees will be required; in those cases where there is reasonable evidence that the requester may possibly fail to pay the fees which would be accrued by processing his request, an advance deposit of 100 percent of the estimated fees will be required. The notice or request for an advance deposit shall extend an offer to the requester whereby he is afforded an opportunity to revise the request in a manner calulated to reduce the fees. Dispatch of such a notice or request shall suspend the running of the period for response by the Agency until a reply is received from the requester.
- (c) The schedule of fees for services performed in responding to requests for Agency records is established as follows:
- (1) For each one quarter hour, or fraction thereof, spent by clerical personnel in searching for a record, \$1.50;
- (2) For each one quarter hour, or fraction thereof, spent by professional personnel in searching for a record, \$3.50;

- (3) For each on-line computer search, \$11.00:
- (4) For each off-line (batch) computer search of Central Reference files, \$27.00;
- (5) For all other off-line computer searches of Agency files, \$8.00 per minute of Central Processing Unit (CPU) time;
- (6) For copies of paper documents in sizes not larger than 8½ × 14 inches, \$0.10 per copy of each page;
- (7) For duplication of non-paper mecha (film, magnetic tape, etc.) or any document that cannot be reproduced on a standard office copier, actual direct cost; and
- (8) For extra copies of reports, maps, reference aids, and other Agency publications, actual cost.
- (d) Inasmuch as the Agency's systems of records are highly decentralized, several computer searches may be required to process a request, depending upon its scope. The computer search costs given in paragraph (c), of this section, do not include whatever professional/clerical search time is needed to determine whether the records located are in fact responsive to the request.
- (e) Search fees are assessable even when no records pertinent to the requests, or no releasable records are found, provided the requester has been advised of this fact and he has, that notwithstanding agreed to incur the costs of search.
- (f) For requests which have accrued substantial search and duplication fees, or for requests for records which have been previously released, or where there is reasonable evidence that the requester may possibly fail to pay the accrued fees, then, at the discretion of the Coordinator, the requester may be required to pay the accrued search and duplication fees prior to the actual delivery of the requested records; otherwise, the requester shall be billed for such fees at the time that the records are provided. Payment shall be remitted by check or money order, made payable to the Treasurer of the United States, and shall be sent to the Coordinator. No appeals or additional requests shall be accepted for processing until the requester has paid all outstanding charges for services rendered under this part.

Dear Sir:

This is an appeal pursuant to subsection (a) (6) of the Freedom of Information Act, as amended (5 U.S.C. 552). I received a letter dated 28 December 1984 Special Agent in Charge Richard Held, of the San Juan Federal Bureau of Investigation Field Office denying my request for for twenty two (22) documents in their entirety. I am enclosing a copy of my initial request and their latest response so that you can see what I have specifically asked for and the insubstancial grounds on which my request has been denied.

You will note that your agency has witheld nearly the entire file, releasing only four (4) pages, of what I requested. Since the FOIA provides that "any reasonably segregable portion of a record shall be provided to any person requesting such record after deletion of the portions which are exempt," I believe that your agency has not complied with the FOIA. I ask that all the information be downgraded so that it can be released in its entirety. I believe that there must be segregable portions which do not fall within the FOIA exemptions and which must be released.

Your agency has invoked the (b) (1) exemption to withold information which I believe is of importance to public debate. As you know, section 3-303 of Executive Order 12065 states that, in order to withold information, a senior agency official must "determine whether the public interest in disclosure outweighs the damage to national security that might reasonably be expected from disclosure." In this case, the importance of the information requested outweighs such possible damage.

In my initial request I asked for a copy of FBI San Juan Office document (185-67) dated 26 June 1979, which I believe contains my name. This document was published in La Cronica newspaper, November 1983, copy of which I am enclosing entitled "Cuba Spies on Exiles in Puerto Rico". I intend to send a copy of my document to La Cronica newspaper so the information is made available to the public.

In that document, the name of the man in charge of security of the Cuban team was deleated because of the (b) (7) (c) exemption for unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. However, because the Cuban security agent is a foreign national who does not even reside in the United States, the Privacy Act does not apply to him, since it is only for American citizens and registered aliens. The (b) (7) (c) exemption was also used to delete the rest of the names of the anti-Castro Cuban exiles and restaurants they frequent in the San Juan area. The names of these restaurants should also be released, since the are public places that do not come under the protection of the Privacy Act. Furthermore, I do not believe any of the eighty four (84) names of the anti-Castro Cuban exile activists would fall under the (b) (7) (c) exemption protec-

ting their privacy, since they are singled out as "activists", or public figures. Since this list of eighty four (84) names was compiled by the Cuban Communist regime, an avowed enemy of the activists mentioned. I believe they would not object to their names being revealed because being singled out constitutes a threat to them from Cuba.

I trust that upon examination of my request, you will conclude that the records I have requested are not properly covered by exemptions (b) (1), (b) (7) (c), (b) (7) (d) and (j) (2) of the amended FOIA, and that you will overrule the decision to withold the information.

If you choose instead to continue to withold some or all of the material which was denied in my initial request to your agency I ask that you give me an index of such material, together with the justification for the denial of each item which is still witheld.

You appealed from the action of the San Juan Field Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on your request for access to records pertaining to yourself, including document number 185-67.

As a result of discussions between Bureau personnel and members of my staff, a supplemental release of five pages is enclosed. In light of this fact and after careful consideration of your appeal, I have otherwise decided to affirm the action in this case. You are alluded to briefly in seven files, the subjects of which are other individuals or organizations. The Field Office has processed only the portions of those files which pertain to you. Certain of the material pertaining to you is classified and I am affirming the denial of access to it on the basis of 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(1). The Department Review Committee has determined that this material warrants continued classification under Executive Order 12356. Other materials were properly withheld from you pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(C) and (7)(D). These provisions pertain to investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would, respectively, constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties, in some instances by revealing an investigative interest in them on the part of the FBI, and disclose the identities of confidential sources and/or confidential information furnished only by such sources. Names of Bureau agents were among the items excised on the basis of 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(C). None of the information being withheld is appropriate for discretionary release.

Please be advised that, as the Field Office advised you by letter dated September 23, 1985, your name was not indexed to document 185-67. Accordingly, that document was not processed in response to your request.

Your request for itemization of the materials withheld, with justification in each instance, is denied. In my opinion, such a listing is not required and would be unreasonably burdensome for this Department to compile at the administrative stage of processing Freedom of Information Act requests and appeals.

Judicial review of my action on this appeal is available to you in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you reside or have your principal place of business, or in the District of Columbia, or in the District of Puerto Rico, which is where the records you seek are located.

ANTONIO POO BENCOMO voluntarily appeared at the Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Federal Building, Hato Rey, Puerto Rico, and furnished the following information:

POO advised that he is not a member of the Coordination of United Revolutionary Organizations (CORU) nor has he ever collected money or donated to this group. POO stated that he is a former member of the Ejercito de Liberacion Cubano (Cuban Army of Liberation) (ELC) and a current member of the Comite Conjunto. POO stated that he has collected money for these two groups in the past and is currently collecting money for the Comite Conjunto to be used in making a notion picture depicting the superiority of soviet military might over that of the United States.

POO admitted knowing IGNACIO CASTRO MATOS who according to POO, was collecting money during December 1976, for the defense fund of OnLANDO BOSCH in Venezuela. POO gave IGNACIO CASTRO money for BOSCH's defense fund but denied that this was a CORU sponsored collection effort.

POO stated that he does not support anti-Castro terrorism or indiscriminate bombings and that such tactics only hinder the anti-Castro movement and demage its image. However, he openly favors armed attacks against Cuba by Cuban exiles but feels that these attacks should logically be directed from within Cuba. By way of illustration, POO hypothetically stated that if asked to donate \$10,000.00 to finance the assassination of RICARDO ALARCON, Cuban Ambassador to the United Nations, he would take out a bank loan for that amount and pay the money, however if he were asked to donate \$.50 for an anti-Castro attack against Viasa airlines in Miramar, Puerto Rico, to protest the imprisonment of ORLANDO BOSCH in Venezuela, he would refuse.

POO stated that he could provide no additional information concerning the two recent Omega Seven bombings in San Juan other than what he had heard on the radio. noted that Omega Seven is a clandestine, anti-Castro terrorist group; however, in his opinion, a left-wing Communist group could have been responsible for the bombings because Publish Records Service, Incorporated (Inc.), one of the establishments hit by Omega Seven, was owned by an anti-Castro Cuban exile.





On October 6, 1978, two high order explosive devices exploded at the Girasol Travel Agency, Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, and Publish Records Service, Inc., Hato Rey, Puerto Rico. WKAQ El Mundo radio station, San Juan, received a call from "Omega Seven" taking credit for these bombings. Omega Seven is a pseudonym for the anti-Castro group CORU.

On October 10, 1978, Antonio Poo was interviewed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) concerning the above two bombings and furnished the following information:

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Poo stated that he could provide no additional information concerning the two recent Omega Seven bombings in San Juan other than what he had heard on the radio. Poo noted that omega Seven is a clandestine, anti-Castro terrorist group; however, in his opinion, a left-wing Communist group could have been responsible for the bombings because Publish Records Service, Incorporated, one of the establishments hit by Omega Seven, was owned by an anti-Castro Cuban exile.

Poo stated that Publish Records Service, Inc. had arranged for the telecast on Telemundo, Channel 2, San Juan, . of a film produced in Cuba. Poo met with Manolo Urquiza, Channel 2 executive and television personality, concerning this film. Poo, who is a friend of Urquiza, criticized' Channel 2's decision to telecast a Communist production; however, Urquiza convinced Poo that he was wrong about this The film was a musical production, performed at the film. nightclub "Tropicana" and had nothing to do with politics. In addition, Urquiza had helped arrange for Ramon Barquin, a well known anti-Castro activist, to critique and comment on both the film and the Castro regime immediately preceding the telecast. Poo noted, however, that due to internal policy at Channel 2 this commentary was not prepared, and as a consequence, the telecast of this film was cancelled.

Poo stated that on October 1, 1978, he was at the Cuban Social Club, Casa Cuba, and spoke with Secundino Carrera. Carrera told Poo that Frank Castro was in San Juan, and would probably be arriving at Casa Cuba between 4 PM and 6 PM. Carrera did not mention that Castro had been accompanied by Hector Cabrera. Poo noted that he does not know a Hector Cabrera. Carrera did not mention to Poo the reason for Castro's visit to San Juan. Poo did not meet with either Frank Castro or Reinol Rodriguez the weekend of September 30-October 2, 1978. Poo stated he has not seen Reinol Rodriguez for almost three months.
