SANTIAGO ALVAREZ was interviewed at his residence, 541 N. W. 45th Avenue.

He was advised by Special Agent that he did not have to make any statements and any Statements he made could be used against him in a court of law. He was advised that he had the right to consult an attorney. Mr. ALVAREZ stated he would be glad to answer any question whatsoever regarding his activities. ALVAREZ stated he is a medical doctor and is presently engaged in extensive study in an effort to pass the Florida State Medical Examinations in order that he may achieve a physician status in Florida.

Some time in the middle of November, Father DIEGO MADRIGAL, a Cuban priest whom ALVAREZ knew slightly in Cuba, came to his residence in company with Father JRAN BAPTISTE GEORGES, a Haitian priest whom ALVAREZ had not previously met. MADRIGAL stated that Father GEORGES was active in seeking the overthrow of the dictator of Haiti, DUVALIER. Both Fathers MADRIGAL and GEORGES stated they were looking for assistance from Cuban refugees in Miami who had been active in anti-CASTRO activities. They asked for ALVAREZ' help in this regard and also asked if he knew where a boat could be obtained.

ALVAREZ stated he was not interested in the problems of these men and added, in his opinion, the Cuban problem is in no way related to the Haitian problem. He, therefore told the priests that he could offer them no assistance and could not help them to obtain a boat because, as a matter of fact, he had no access to boats. He understood both Fathers MADRIGAL and GEORGES returned to New York, and he has not heard from them since.
