Exiles ask INS to free Bosch Miami Heald More than 60 Cuban exile groups in Miami asked the Immigration and Naturalization Service on Wednesday to free anti-Castro ac-

tivist Orlando Bosch from the Metropolitan Correctional Center in

Southwest Dade.

"Bosch remains imprisoned without having committed a crime or violated any law," said state Sen. Ileana Ros-Lehtinen, R-Miami, who organized the effort. She and the groups — all of which declared

Bosch, 62, to his family while officials decide if he can stay in the United States. Bosch arrived illegally to Miami last year from Venezuela and could be ordered deported.

Mario Ortiz, of the INS in Dallas, said Bosch's case was under review and he did not know when officials would made a decision.
