## Democrats disagree on what to do with Bosch The mere mention of Orlando Bosch, the Cuban

The mere mention of **Orlando Bosch**, the Cuban exile ordered deported by the U.S. Justice Department for being an "unwavering terrorist," brings a collective groan from the Democratic field.

It's a no-win issue, most candidates complain: Say he should be deported and risk outrage from Cuban exiles. Say he shouldn't and court ridicule from everyone else.

Pressed to choose, the Democrats come down on opposite sides. Former Miami Commissioner Rosario Kennedy and lawyer Gerald Richman invoke humanitarian grounds in calling for Bosch to stay in the United States.

Kennedy: "How can we ask the Chinese to stop killing each other if we're going to send Orlando to a firing squad?"

But ex-probation officer JoAnn Pepper and educator Marvin Dunn say Bosch should go, despite

fears for his safety overseas.

"I think Bosch ought to be deported, and it took me a week to come to that conclusion," Dunn says. "But the FBI, the CIA, the Justice Department, the federal judge — hey, at some point you can't buy this story about 'planted information.'"

Says Pepper: "The Justice Department has to

do what is right."
