## Exile Raiders Foiled In Keys

The U.S. crackdown on commando raids against Cuba won approval today of Senate leaders and at the same time an exile group in Miami reported one of their boats had been seized on the high seas by U.S. and British authorities.

Dr. Orlando Bosch, coordinator of the anti-Communist Cuban Army, said the boat was taken off No Name Key.

But another boat escaped and continued toward Cuba. "If it is taken, it will have to be taken by force," Bosch said.

## **GUNS CAPTURED**

According to the exiles announcement, an American de-

stroyer, another American vessel, a British vessel and aircraft took part in the capture.

The captured boat was under command of Evelio Duque, one of the top anti-Castro fighters in Cuba's Escambray Mountains. He and 14 other Cubans were taken as well as cannon and machineguns.

Duque had left Cuba to pick up a supply of guns and ammunition and was returning when captured, the report said.

## IN CONFLICT

In Washington, Sen. Mike Mansfield, (D-Mont.), the Senate majority leader, and Sen. Everett M. Dirksen, (R-Ill.), the minority leader, agreed that hit-run raids

might involve the U.S. in conflict.
