

U.S. 'Bugs' Them Here, Exiles Say

A protest to President Johnson and to the Organization of American States over alleged persecution by U. S. officials is planned by Orlando Bosch, a Cuban exile leader.

Bosch, head of the Revolutionary Recovery Insurrectional Movement (MIRR), told a news conference in Miami last night that microphones and recording devices had been found in the walls of his headquarters here.

He said his organization "is the object of persecutions by American officials" and that he planned protests to the President and the OAS.

Bosch called a press conference following his release from jail at Orlando, where he was arrested June 13 on a federal charge of conspiracy to export arms.

Three other Cuban exiles and two Americans also were arrested on the conspiracy charge. Bosch was released on bond after a 72-hour hunger strike in jail.
