(TRANSCRIPT FROM RECORDS.)

It appears from the records filed in this Office, that Phillip Alongo, Pvt. Co. E, 3^d U.S. Arty., entered Chesapeake L. H., Fort Monroe, Va., May 22, 1864, from City Point, with "Compound fract. right forearm Extensd burn F and Neck", wounded at Petersburg, Va., May 20, 1864, by a minnie ball. Under date June 21, 1864, treated for: "Amputation of right forearm. Development of Erysipelas". Transferred June 3, 1864. Remarks: amputation performed at the front. Peter Orbanego, Sgnt. Co. E, 1st U.S. Arty., entered Delcamp L. H., David's Island, N.Y. Harbor, Augt 27, 1864, "with loss of right arm, loss both eyes", caused by a shell at Petersburg, and was transferred to Insane Asylum, Washington, D.C., Jan'y 10, 1865. No further record in this case found.
