New York City. — having furnished satisfactory evidence of his fitness for a Company Officer, is hereby authorized to enroll Volunteers to serve in the Army of the United States for three years or during the war to be attached to the "Defendus", Colonel Praulik

This authorization is granted on the express condition that such enrollment shall be in all respects in conformity with the provisions of General Orders No. 126, War Department, and such other rules and regulations as have been or may be established. When one-half a company has been mustered into service, the First Lieutenant thereof can be mustered in, and when the organization of the company is completed the Captain and Second Lieutenant can be mustered.
