

Mo. 15th, at Cavalry Riga
Prestonville Aug 15/62

Genl. I have just information through
Courier to day that the forces at Sparta
are not so numerous as has been represented
and I am of the opinion that if I were
to make a move on that section that
it would create a disturbance generally
along their lines and out of the impression
that they would fall back.

I have not yet rec'd. any
of the forces which have to prove friend
or my (from Chattanooga) - but hope they
will arrive on Sunday as I am anxious
to move on Monday morning.

Col. Morgan crossed the Cumberland
River on Sunday and occupied Hickman County
Miles of Gallatin - and I suppose ear
that has advanced on that place.

I know to day that the Federals
were much alarmed on Monday - & yesterday
an attack from Col. Morgan on the south
and that I would attack them on this
side — The road leading across "Harden's"
Ridge from White Creek to Crossville —
and from Crossville to Sparta is the best road
for Artillery or heavy loads. It again —
