Make the following  
report in detail the result of my  
inspection on my term of duty this day  
Camp of Siege Train Lt. Brown's Company

This Camp is in good order  
a party of 3 men is detached every  
morning to clean it. The stables  
are cleaned daily by the Drivers,  
it has Sinks, the Detachment  
wells at 5 P.M. daily. they have  
no Roll Calls.

Camp of Siege Train Lt. Chapman's Company

This Camp is cleaned about 3 times a  
week, it has Sinks, they have one  
well a day no Roll Calls.

These two Camps are located at the Bottom  
near Legare's Point, and have not  
more than 30 or 40 men at each.

Coast Lines. Capt. Legare's Company has  
Change of three Batteries and the Ordnance  
Store at Middleburg,

Batteries No 1 & 2 have Sinks, the quarters  
of each detachment are kept in good

order, they discharge 3 times a week at  
6 P.M.

Battalion No 3 has no Sinks, the Camp  
is in very good order, they work  
in the morning daily, the Sentinels  
at each of these Battalions are attentive  
to their duties.

Capt Dawson has Charge of three Battalions  
There is but a small detachment  
at each of these Battalions, Battalion No  
1 has no Sinks, most of the men  
at this Battalion have been sick, I ordered  
Sinks to be built there at once, finding  
they had men to do so, Battalion No 2  
has Sinks, the Camps of these two  
Battalions are not so clean as they should  
be, Battalion No 3 has Sinks, this Camp  
is in very good order.

Capt Hunter has 3 Battalions, the Camps  
at each of these Battalions must be cleaned  
they work twice a day, the Camps  
are provided with Sinks.

Capt Kinard has 3 Battalions, his Camp  
is in very good order, being located  
near the mouth of the river, the  
men are this location as Sinks.

574 George Reef, a Guard is posted on the  
 Roxy at night, Camp Clean, and  
 two Sinks, 3 Roll Calls each day  
 and Company inspection every afternoon,  
 Chatham Artillery, Camp Clean, (Sinks) the  
 Edge of the March land is used for  
 this purpose, the Camp is policed  
 daily at 4 P.M. 5 Roll Calls each  
 day.

Capt Blake's Artillery, Camp Clean it is  
 policed every morning by the Company  
 under charge of the Officer of the day.  
 The Camp being new Dills break, the  
 men use that place as Sinks,  
 9 Roll Calls each day, a Guard  
 is posted day & night.

6th Geo Reef, This Camp will scarcely  
 pass inspection, it is policed daily,  
 they have no Guard, two Roll Calls,  
 Improved Col Lofter that my order  
 were "that he must establish a Guard",  
 they have Sinks,

Capt Edwards' Cavalry Camp, This Camp  
 could be kept in better order, it is  
 policed every afternoon, they have  
 Sinks, two Roll Calls each day, they

have no ground, they will establish a Guard  
19th Geo Regt in bivouac between Battery  
Glover & Sells Bluff, will establish  
a Guard & build Sinks,  
Battery Glover, The Rain Sinks is used  
as a sink, by the Command at this  
post. Camp Clean and Ground  
attention to duties,

32 Geo Regt, in bivouac near Cross  
Roads, Ground attention to duty, the  
bivouac ground has been cleaned  
up and is in good order, a Guard  
is established on the Road at night  
and in the day a Sentinel is posted  
at the <sup>Regt</sup> Commissary stores, they have  
the best Sinks of my Command in this  
division.

1st Battalion 25<sup>th</sup> Geo. Camp Clean they have  
a Guard day & night at the Com-  
missary stores, they have Sinks,  
will clean once a day when not  
on Picket duty.

Capt. Johnson Artillery, two Sentinels Posted,  
Camp Cleaned daily, two Sinks,  
3 Roll Calls each day.

2<sup>nd</sup> Battn 25<sup>th</sup> S.C.V. This Camp is Clean, has  
Drinks, one half of this Battalion is on  
Picket each night, they have no Guard,  
two Roll Calls each day & dress Parades  
whenever orders are to be published.

I would respectfully report that I found  
the sentinels at this Post and attention  
to their duties, I placed Private Currier  
off Capt McJuncos's Company, under arrest  
for discharging his Rifle near the Camp  
of the 6<sup>th</sup> Regt at 11/4 am, and  
in the afternoon while at the Camp of the  
32<sup>nd</sup> Regt a Rifle was discharged  
in this ground by one of the men  
I requested Lt Col Pomeroy to place the  
man under arrest.

The condition of the Slaughter House  
and Pen near Dells Bluff is such  
as to be very offensive to the troops  
in Camp near there, I ordered it to  
be cleaned up.
